OCTOBER 16TH PROGRAM

Paul Domoto. Bhutan: Land of the Thunder Dragon.

Club member Paul Domoto and his wife, Marlaine, recently visited Bhutan, also known as the “Living Edens.” Bhutan is located immediately south of China and just to the east of India. As such, it is part of the Himalayan mountain region. It is among the last of the kingdoms, with a history of strong British influence. The culture of Bhutan focuses on GNH: Gross National Happiness! The country is about the size of Iowa with population of about 750,000. The mountainous terrain can make for slow going; it can take up to 2 hours to travel by car for no more than a few dozen miles. Bhutan agriculture is primarily based upon rice production. It contains two small airports. Much of the agricultural labor is by hand, oxen carts, or primitive gas-powered vehicles. The principle religion is Buddhism. The country is very beautiful, hosting many spectacular waterfalls and temples: lots of temples! Traditional dress of ghos for men and kiras for women is common and even expected at many events. The residents of Bhutan enjoy archery. A fire-breathing “magic penis,” representing fertility, adorns many public and private buildings.
