GOAL: To build, retain and support a growing Kiwanis membership network

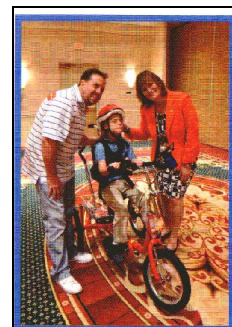
IMPACT - MEANINGFUL SERVICE

The Lakewood Kiwanis Scholarship Foundation Board has begun its selection of the 2016 scholarship recipients, will have interviews later this month and make their final selection of six local resident seniors each to receive a \$10,000 scholarship.

The Eliminate Project - The Kiwanis International Foundation has announced pledges and gifts totaling over \$110 million; lives saved and protected - 61 plus million; 13 nations have scheduled immunizations for this year; 13 districts are committed and are still working to fulfill their goals.

The Ohio District of Kiwanis has raised, to date, over \$2.5 million with 1.44 million lives saved or protected.

At a special Lakewood Kiwanis Board meeting the board approved recognition of six Lakewood Kiwanis members with "Hixen Awards" or "Tablets of Honor" for their contributions and support to the club's programs and to "The Eliminate Project".
