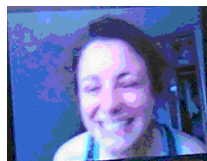
## Spotlight On.....

Our first of two speakers was **Craig Smith** visiting us from Division 10, Columbus, Ohio. Craig is the Eliminate Project Coordinator for his division. Craig brought with him the good news about the project having raised over \$91 Million thus far for the elimination of maternal and neonatal tetanus (MNT) in 16 third world countries with validation efforts going on in an additional 17 countries. Each \$1.80 received will provide immunization for a mother and her future children.

**Lakewood Kiwanis Archives 1924**

IN JUNE, LAKEWOOD PUBLIC LIBRARY'S FIRST ADDITION WAS DEDICATED. THE REPUBLICAN PARTY CONVENED IN CLEVELAND TO NOMINATE CALVIN COOLIDGE FOR RE-ELECTION. THE DETROIT THEATRE OPENED; AND LAKEWOOD'S NEW POLICE DEPARTMENT WAS LOCATED IN THE REMODELED CUYAHOGA TELEPHONE BUILDING ON WARREN ROAD.

THE CITY'S FIRST HIGH-RISE, THE 5-STORY DETROIT-WARREN MEDICAL BUILDING BOASTED LAKEWOOD'S FIRST ELEVATOR.

AND ALSO IN 1924, OUR KIWANIS CLUB WAS LIVING UP TO ITS MOTTO "WE BUILD" BY RECEIVING PERMISSION TO BUILD A RECREATIONAL LODGE FOR UNDER PRIVILEGED BOYS.

FRANK MYERS, OF THE MYERS LUMBER COMPANY AND PRESIDENT OF (THE) CLUB THAT YEAR. ORGANIZED THE MEMBERS TO BUILD, PAINT AND OPERATE THE KJWANIS LODGE. IT WAS DEDICATED FREE OF DEBT, AND THEN TURNED OVER TO THE LAKEWOOD YMCA FOR RECREATIONAL AND CHARACTER BUILDING PURPOSES FOR BOYS & YOUNG MEN IN THE COMMUNITY.

THE KIWANIS LODGE EVENTUALLY CLOSED IN 1970 AT THE REQUEST OF THE METROPOLITAN PARK BOARD, BUT NOT BEFORE HELPING THOUSANDS OF YOUNGSTERS LEARN MORE ABOUT RECREATIONAL AND NATURE STUDIES IN THE FABULOUS "EMERALD NECKLACE."
