KIWANIS PUSHES FOR \$66 MILLION TO REACH 2015 GOAL FOR THE ELIMINATE PROJECT

We're getting there.

With less than two years left in The Eliminate Project fundraising campaign, Kiwanis members have raised nearly \$44 million in funds.

But there's still more work to be done. We must raise an additional \$66 million by 2015 to

eliminate maternal and neonatal tetanus—and ensure no mother faces the death of her baby simply because she didn't have access to a safe birthing environment or three doses of the tetanus vaccine that cost only \$1.80.

At last count, 25 countries, including Ethiopia, Chad, Haiti, Indonesia, Kenya and Yemen, were still at risk of the deadly diseases and need our help.

Lakewood Kiwanis raised over \$425 in December for the ELIMINATE Project with more coming in during January, bringing our total to over \$19,000.

Consider using the plastic containers that were distributed to collect your loose change donations each day.

Our 2014 Goal is to raise an additional \$7,000 for the Eliminate Project!
