The Role of the Federal Reserve

Part 2 -

"Currency"

Each year, the Federal Reserve Board determines the number of new Federal Reserve notes that are needed to meet the public's demand and submits a print order to the Treasury's Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP). The order reflects the Board's assessment of the expected growth rates for payments of currency to and receipts of currency from circulation. The Federal Reserve pays the BEP the cost of printing new currency and arranges and pays the cost of transporting the currency from the BEP facilities in Washington, D.C., and Fort Worth, Texas, to Reserve Bank cash offices.

When a depository institution orders currency from a Reserve Bank, the Reserve Bank prepares and releases the shipment to an armored carrier. When a depository institution deposits currency with a Reserve Bank, the Reserve Bank stores the currency in secure vaults until it is verified, noteby-note, on sophisticated processing the pieceequipment. During process, verification currency is counted, suspect counterfeit notes are identified, and unfit notes are destroyed. The fit currency is packaged and returned to the vault, and is used to fill future orders from depository institutions. The Reserve Banks send all suspect counterfeit notes to the United States Secret Service for examination and final adjudication.
