Help Pass Out Food To The Vulnerable In
Lakewood

*The city's Department of Aging needs volunteers to
distribute food throughout the city.*

— The Lakewood Division of Aging is looking for
volunteers to help deliver meals throughout the city. A
spokesperson for the department said that volunteers
don't need to make a major commitment; they can drop
off meals once a week, or once a month.

The program requires roughly one hour a week, starting
at 10:30 a.m. Volunteers pick up bags of food at 16024
Madison Avenue and then hit the route.

"I always tell people that you may not be able to deliver
meals, but you probably know someone that could
deliver the meals," said DeDe MacNamee-Gold,
Lakewood Division of Aging.

1. MacNamee said the department can make
accommodations for volunteers. For example, if
a volunteer is unable to drive, the department
will give them a route that is within an
apartment building. Another example of the
department's flexibility: a team of people will
rotate to share part of a week or month of
deliveries.

How long have you been skating?

I joined BRRD as an NSO in 2009. I became a skater in 2010. I have been roller skating since I was 3 years old. My mom had me on skates and I hated them. (I actually threw them away) Within the next year, I fell in love with skating and have been ever since!

What is your favorite derby moment?

Being captain of the Hard Knockers in season 8. Even though we still came in 3rd place that season, we had the best record we have had since early seasons. I believe we had a winning season in season 2. We had a very positive season that year.

What is your pre-bout routine? Any rituals?

I actually do not have anything major. I do prep food and generally eat peanut butter and jelly sandwiches. I do my best to focus. I listen to a few songs on the way to the venue. That's about it!

What does your derby name mean?

It is based off of Arthur "Fonzie" Fonzarelli's girlfriend from "Happy Days." Many people think my number is from the band 311, but it is actually not. March 11 is the day my best friend passed away. She would have LOVED roller derby and I wear that number as a reminder that I play to make her happy. Making her happy keeps her close to me everyday. I also feel that she watches over me when I play.

How important is derby in your life?

Derby has given me confidence. I have Crohn's Disease and sometimes the disease really breaks you down. I have grown both mentally and physically since joining derby. I have joined an online support group for other roller derby skaters who have invisible diseases and have learned so much from them. I appreciate being able to challenge myself and not let the disease control what I can and cannot do. It has made me a better person in every aspect of my life.
