The tragic murderous events of September 11, 2001 changed our lives in many ways. The personal safety of everyone became even more endangered than before. On that day the Transportation Service Administration (TSA) did not exist and had zero employees. One year later the TSA did exist and had 60,000 employees and had an agenda to safeguard each of us and America.



Our guest speaker, last week, Mr. Tom Cianciolo of the TSA, is a native of Cleveland who played an important role in the federalization of Cleveland Hopkins International Airport. He reminded us of the extreme effort his group puts forth each and every day to safeguard our safety and that of America.

Highlights of his talk included recent events in protecting our safety. The efforts of the TSA include 22 layers of protection; from pre-checking of individuals on passenger lists to inspecting "cargo being unloaded at our ports of entry. They also are active in foreign airports where flights might be made to the U.S. or even pass through our air space. Passengers continue to try to take restricted items on board airplanes. On the average the TSA confiscates five loaded firearms each day. Items such as belts that become rigid swords hollowed out laptop computers, hand grenades, dynamite, knives of all shapes and sizes. Contraband has been found under wheel chairs and in diaper bags.

These layers of protected include new body scanners that use radio wave pulses not radiation and scan through clothing, random checks and armed air marshals usually two on random flights. Recently initiated is express checking which also includes individuals age 75 years and older may use. Individuals who are selected for more thorough checks may request a private screening area for personal or religious reasons.

The administration does not have authority to arrest anyone but turns that responsibility over to local authorities. It does however have the authority to administer civil fines up to \$11,000.
