The Kiwanis Club of Lakewood will be hosting its 39th annual Doughnut and Cider Sale on Wednesday, October 21, from 8 am to 6 pm, and Thursday, October 22, from 7 am to 10 am.

The doughnuts will be sold or delivered from St. Clement Church Hall, 2022 Lincoln Ave. (corner of Lincoln Ave. and Madison Ave.) for \$7.50 per dozen. They come in five varieties: plain, sugared, cinnamon, vanilla icing, and chocolate icing. A standard box has four plain donuts and two of each of the other varieties. Buyers may also place advance orders for customized selections. Cider from local orchards will be \$5.00 for a half gallon.

Pre-sale orders for doughnuts can be given to any Lakewood Kiwanis member. Lakewood High School Key Club members will also accept orders.



The Cleveland Sight Center, founded in 1906 is a non-profit 501(c)(3) that has many successes over the 100 plus years of its existence. Last year alone they serviced over 13,000 people and 16,000 in community education. Over 7,000 three to five year old children were tested for eye diseases.

The center is funded through an endowment, individual donations and ever decreasing government support. Thousands of volunteer hours are donated each year. The many activities at the center which include golf, learning to use the computer and sailing. The sailing experience includes taking over the sailing activities by the sight impaired. Desmond Kennedy is the Recreation Specialist and he works to provide a long list of activities for the sight impaired to help them to lead normal active lives. The "Eyedea" retail shop is where Alicia Howerton works selling many items to assist the sight impaired.
