Information and Duties

General Info:

- Train Day is all about fun, so make the experience with guest a memorable one
- Photograph and record activities of event for historical purposes and for future Facebook postings

Responsibilities

- Use your personal, good quality, memory card capable camera to take a variety of photographs of event in progress
- You are the historian of the event, so take huge amounts of pictures of all that is happenings through out the day
- You do not need to get up close and personal to take great photos of what is happening and capturing the fun guest are enjoying
- Be cognizant and respectful of guest privacy, taking many pictures in angles that show guest from the side or rear
- Utilize the telephoto capabilities of your camera to capture shots from a distance, so as to not interrupt guest or draw attention to your shooting pictures, therefore capturing guest in a more natural state and not posed
- Capture shots of guests overall, in areas of activity such as in a room with a crowd around a train table, or a group waving as a train passes by, or a group of kids on the train going in a circle
- Be creative in your shots so as to capture human interest and train related activates of our guest
- Capture street shots of lots of guest walking around, showing the enormous appeal of our event
- Capture the mascots interacting with little ones. The mascots draw a wide variety of folks and provides a great opportunity to see guest and the mascots interacting
- Check out music venues and look for guest enjoying the music and kids dancing
- Be very creative and open minded in your search for shots
- Be able to provide your memory card for copying for the event staff to save
