PROJECT REPORTS

- Project Eliminate. Kiwanis International has joined with USAID and UNICEF to Eliminate
 Maternal-Neonatal Tetanus. The Board of Directors is offering a \$250 incentive for those
 persons wishing to become a Zeller Award Winner. Also, the NE-IA District is offering a \$625/
 \$625 match (see attached).

- Circle K Club. Circle K is adjourned until fall semester.


