## SEPTEMBER 22ND PROGRAM

### YWCA: Girls Power

GIRLS Power is a mentoring program for sixth and seventh grade girls at Ames and Nevada Middle Schools who are living out the YWCA mission of eliminating racism and empowering women. In cooperation with their ISU female student mentors, these young women plan and participate in biweekly activities based on the five GIRLS Power focus areas: Community Service, Leadership Development, Career Exploration, Diversity and FUN!

The GIRLS Power program in Ames, which partners with ISU students, sponsors approximately 50 pairs of 7th graders with college students. Participants meet every other week as a group to discuss issues facing girls and women today. The program serves international students by assisting women new to the U.S. in getting established, learning English, negotiating the bus system, and engaging in the ISU and Ames communities. The International Friendship Fair shares food, stories, and friendship among international and domestic students.

GIRLS Power is sponsored by the YWCA, which is one of the oldest and largest women's organizations in the nation, serving over 2 million women, girls, and their families. YWCA focuses on Racial Justice and Civil Rights, Empowerment and Economic Advancement of Women and Girls, and Health and Safety of Women and Girls. YWCA is the nation's largest provider of domestic violence programs and shelters in the United States, serving well over ½ million women and children.
