Instructions

Thank you for taking the time to apply for the Headland award. Each Kiwanis Club in Division 15 may nominate one candidate to compete for the award. The Claremont Kiwanis Club uses an application and an interview process to select its candidate. Seniors at both of Claremont's high schools and attendees at any of the Claremont Colleges are eligible to apply.

In filling out the application, the top three lines can be directly filled-in as part of a writable pdf. Click once on the line to start the process. In submitting items 1 thru 4, send an attachment as a Word or a pdf document.

The primary criterion used in judging is SERVICE to your school and community. This is most important and you should be sure to clearly describe your efforts and any responsibilities you had in performing that service. Membership in a Kiwanis sponsored organization is desirable but not required.

By Thursday, February 22, your completed application must be emailed to arnybloom@mac.com. Interviews will be held the following week.

The Division 15 Headland Scholarship Committee will make the final selection of the recipients and the amount of the awards.
