Program:

Joe Tregoning an energy consultant, described renewable energy from farms with a focus on manure digesters. Joe has been in the state legislature, representing southwestern Wisconsin, and was on the staff of Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection.

Manure digesters have become a part of nutrient management plans on several large dairy farms. In central Wisconsin, the concern is nitrates in groundwater. In south central Wisconsin, the issue is phosphorous getting into the waterways. Phosphorous and nitrogen have been important nutrients in the animal manure needed for fertilizer. Many of the soils in south central Wisconsin do not need any additional phosphorous

These digesters animal manure create methane gas which is used to power an engine which drives a electrical generator producing electricity for the farm and for sale to electrical utility company. The solids remaining can be dried and sold. Many farms use the dried solids for animal bedding. The liquid is applied to farm fields providing plant nutrients.

The digesters are also being considered to process food wastes from food processing plants and other businesses producing large quantities of wastes. In all cases, bio-materials considered wastes in the past are now resources,.
