Program: Dr. Barbara Bower, Associate Dean for Research in the UW-Madison Nursing School, shared research results on caregivers and caregiving for older adults and people with lifelong disabilities.

Family members provide twenty-five percent of the caregiving costing them \$400 to 670 per month with an average of two to three visits per month. The average age of family caregiver is 49 years and 30 % miss work.

Professional caregivers have issues such as low salaries, overtime work requirement, little continuing education and large number of patients. The turnover rate exceeds 80% per year. Another caregiving challenge is the difficulty for patients to transition from the hospital to rehabilitative care whether to a community facility or home.
