Program: James Brogan, with the UW-Madison Transportation Services, described the role of the services on campus. Parking is the primary role.

The university has 13,000 parking spots on campus, which is limited due to the impact more spaces would have on the surrounding Madison community. 9,000 parking spots are purchased and assigned as daily lots, many faculty and staff have daily access. 2,000 spots are for services to the university used by university grounds staff and outside businesses which provide services to the university.

Demand management responsibilities include campus buses and accessible shuttle bus for students with disabilities. They have two park and ride sites, south Park Street and UW Health-Digestive Health. Bus passes for city buses can be purchased by faculty and staff.

They also address bikes, mopeds and scooters. For bikes, racks and lockers are available. Fixing/repair stations are available for bike repair. Mopeds and scooters on campus require permits for specific lots designed for these machines.
