Wisconsin-Upper Michigan Kiwanis District

District Governor Jim Burmeister has developed a membership challenge to the Kiwanis clubs in the district with club rewards if club memberships increases. Obviously he has a concern with the membership trends in the district. He provided three opportunities to gain recognition as a club.

1. If a club increases its membership two or more members during the 2015-16 Kiwanis year, the club will receive the Governor's Honor Roll of Growing Clubs.
2. If a club has the largest percentage increase or the largest increase in the number of members in a Kiwanis division during the 2015-16 Kiwanis year, the club will receive a Diamond Award.
3. For every new member the club will be entered into a lottery which will be used in a drawing for \$1,000.

This should provide support for our Reinvigoration program under the leadership of **Fred Ross**.
