**Program:** David McDonald, professor in the UW-Madison History Department, has expertise in Contemporary Russia and shared the many changes that have occurred in Russia and the previous country, USSR.

#### Some observations:

- Russia seems calm compared to remainder of the world,
- 2. Putin regime changes defied expectations,
- 3. Surging discontent in Russia due the loss in value of the ruble, one half in three years,
- 4. All transactions are negotiable,
- 5. The drop in oil prices from \$100 to \$50 has had a tremendous impact and
- 6. Russian is the second language in some large cities outside Russia such as London.

One major change occurred In the 1980's when privatization was implemented which led to more corruption. Many Russian citizens were given a hectare (2.47 acres) to grow agricultural crops. Within a few short years, one percent of the agricultural land produced the majority of the crops. The large collective farms which controlled the remaining agricultural land were very inefficient.
