Program: Electric Car – How Soon , today’s program, was presented by Robert Lorenz, UW-Madison Mechanical Engineering Professor. A major paradigm shift is happening in the auto industry of transitioning from internal combustion engines to electric vehicles. The primary advantage of the electric vehicle is the braking energy which is returned to the electrical system instead of being lost in the conventional brakes.

The first electric cars were designed for urban use for short distance travel. The travel distance was about 20 miles before requiring the battery to be charged. Tesla, a California company, has designed cars with new battery technology permitting cross country travel of 200 to 250 miles before the battery needs to be charged. Tesla has established a network of high charging rate (20 to 30 minute) stations across the U. S. and in other countries.

The Chinese have entered the electric vehicle market with the Faraday Future and plan to be largest manufacturer in the world.
