Mary developed the Principal for Day, now Principal Experience. The Partnership program was developed to link businesses, civic organizations and other community organizations and enhance the success of the schools. Madison West Kiwanis has a partnership with the Midvale school.

Becky described the paired schools of Midvale and Lincoln School. Midvale has students in grades K – 2 and Lincoln has students in grades 3-5. The Midvale student population is diverse: 14% African-American, 10% Asian, 31% Hispanic, 7% Multi-racial and 38% White. Midvale school has a dual language program. They have four dual language classes and four English only. The second language is Spanish.

Becky listed the activities we have at Midvale: lunch buddies. shared experience, second grade history, field trip chaperone, book fair, i-Pad and playground. Class visits to our meeting hves been discontinued.
