PROGRAM

Kiwanis Youth Protection Training presented by Jerry Miller.

Jerry passed out "Youth Protection Guidelines" article from Kiwanis International. Which is a requirement by International that each club have and annual training session and members receive a copy of the guidelines. *If you wish to read the guidelines you can go to Kiwanis International Policies and Procedures - Procedure 432.*

Abuse can happen at any time. It is the purpose of Kiwanis clubs and members to perform on the highest standard of care when involved with children that participate in the SLP (Service Leadership Programs) clubs and other children oriented projects. Any one working as an advisor to any SLP club needs to have a background check. Through Kiwanis the cost is +/- \$19. The background check is valid for 2 years.

To be a chaperone you must be 21 years of age. *I think we all meet that qualification and then some.* If involved in over night activities there must be 1 adult for every 10 youth. If involved in transportation of youth there should be 2 adults for each youth. When taking a youth home from an activity a call to their parents, giving an estimated time of arrival is a good procedure to follow.

No alcohol or tobacco should be used around youths. If there is any wrongdoing, it should be reported to the proper authorities. In transporting students it is best to use school vehicles with an authorized and licensed driver. If on school property the strictest guidelines should be followed. If there is a health problem, get the youth to the quickest help available.

Adults should not initiate nor interact with youth, such as friending a student on Facebook. All personal information of any youth is to be safely stored and protected from access for a minimum period of 3 years or as required by local and state regulations, after 3 years it is to be shredded.

In other words, use good old common sense. In 1980's we had a member convicted of child molestation and was sent to prison. Fortunately for Granville Kiwanis, the molestation involved the Big Brothers/ Big Sisters organization.

Funding Request discussion

Discussion was held regarding the funding of an off the road vehicle for the Granville Fire Department. The request was for \$15,000. John Hinderer has one Honda 700 vehicle left and is holding it for the fire department. If approved, the vehicle can be purchased. If we pay for the vehicle, John Hinderer will make a donation of \$350 dollars to us. There was also discussion that the trustees could pay for the extras required to bring the vehicle up to standards for use as a fire department vehicle. The amount was approximately \$2,000. The members present voted to approve paying for the Vehicle.

Proposed Tent/Stage/Tables/Chairs policy

1. Club Ops will be paid for all rentals, except:
 - a. When used for club events (e.g. July 4th, Maple Leaf race).
 - b. Non-commercial use where there's no fund raising is intended (e.g. Vacation Bible School, or using the stage at GHS Homecoming)
2. Members must pay for use of the tent or stage:
 - a. Members in good standing get a \$50 discount from the scheduled rental price.
3. With the prior approval of the Tent Committee scheduler, members in good standing may borrow tables and chairs at no cost for non-commercial use at the member's home.
4. The Tent Committee may elect to refuse rentals if:
 - a. Weather conditions would pose excessive wear (e.g. Turkey Trot if temperatures are below 40 degrees).
 - b. The rental is outside Licking County.
5. The Tent Committee reserves the right to trade tent or stage use for the use of equipment owned by other entities (e.g. Newark Kiwanis food trailer).
6. All rentals are for four (4) days maximum. Longer rentals (if available) will be charged at a higher rate.
