DIV. 10E COUNCIL MEETING

Lt. Gov. Jerry Miller opened the meeting with prayer.

The New Albany Kiwanis Club provided the dinner; they did the cooking and the preparations. The menu was Barbecued Hamburgers, Chicken, Bratwurst, Potato and Fruit Salad, Watermelon, Dessert – Cookies, White and Chocolate Cake, plus beverages- sodas, ice tea, coffee, and water.

Lt. Gov. Jerry gave an update from the International Convention for the Eliminate project. The pledges and collected funds now total \$100 million. Key Club has made a pledge of \$3 Million.

Our Division has collected \$100,000 amount out of the total pledges of \$144,000. Three clubs in our Div. are known as Model Clubs - Newark, Granville, and Westerville.

Sam Malik Div. 10E Key Club Lt Gov. with key clubbers and Kiwanians from New Albany had a car wash with the profits going to the Eliminate Project. Their profit for the car wash was \$1,556.

The Ohio District project "Shoes For Hope" which was initiated by Gov. Diane and is now completed, collected 75,000 pairs of shoes, which if they weighted 1 lb. each that amounts to 37.5 tons of shoes. Our club collected 2,600 pairs of shoes or 3.5% of the shoes collected.

Kiwanis International will continue with the "Formula Program" to encourage membership expansion and development. In case you don't remember The Formula is "Love It, Share It, Live It".

Lt. Gov. Jerry inducted five (5) new members into Kiwanis. Four (4) for New Albany and one (1) for Granville. Anna Howe was welcomed to our club by Lesa Miller. Anna received her certificate of membership, Kiwanis pin, tee shirts, and name badge.

- Granville - Pres. Tom mentioned our 4th of July celebration, the Maple syrup project, the tent, chair, table, and stage rental project. And our upcoming 5K – 10K Maple Leaf run to be held on Oct 3rd at the Granville Intermediate School at 8:00 AM. In the discussion of the Maple Syrup project it was mentioned Bob Warner's family has been making maple syrup on their farm for 185 years.
- New Albany – They will be holding their third Annual Trivia Night fundraiser on April 30, 2016. The cost will be \$25 per person. They worked at the "Taste of New Albany" held earlier this month. They will be participating in the New Albany Oktoberfest to be held Oct. 2nd.
- Newark – Bob Handelman mentioned their Strawberries on the Square held off the Square was successful. They recently completed a clown gathering at the Central Christian Church on Mt. Vernon Rd. Aug 20th. They entertained 175 people in the fellowship area. They had a clown from Canada and two from India. The Fish Fry at Camp Obanon will be Sept. 10th (Thurs.). The cost will be \$15. Mike Wesley mentioned they now have a food trailer, which can be rented.
- Westerville – Book Bonanza – they collect used books refurbish the books if needed, label and sort the books and then distribute them to schools. They participated

in the Westerville 4th of July Parade this year. They are planning on organizing a K Kids club at Wilder Elem. School. Miniature Progressive Golf contest 8:30 AM -1:30 PM on Sept 19th. On Oct.12th (Monday) there will be another golf outing at the Raccoon International Course in Granville. The fee, *which I did not hear, if there was one mentioned*, part of which will include golf cart and lunch. There will be sponsor holes. The proceeds will go to the Eliminate Project.

- Worthington Linworth –Designate Lt. Gov. Elect Jim Janasik mentioned there will be an Aktion Club Convention held North of Delaware. He also mentioned the Cleveland Kiwanis Club will be celebrating their 100th Anniversary on Oct 17th (Sat.). The Kiwanis Int. Pres. Susan A. Petrisin will be attending the party. She may visit the Ohio District in May of 2016. They are selling Macy’s Passes for \$5. They will be participating in the Halloween festival in Old Worthington. They still have 100th Anniversary Pins for sale. The proceeds will go to the Eliminate Project. They are also selling a Lithograph, which gives the history of the Kiwanis Int. Logo.
