### PROGRAM -

Dave Thomas introduced our speaker Granville's new Police Chief William R. Caskey. Chief Caskey has been in law enforcement from 1987 – 2012 in Columbus Ohio. He also served in Afghanistan from 2012 -2014 as a law enforcement professional for the U.S. Army.

In his decision to come to Granville, he checked the internet. And one of the things he saw was a police officer participating in the banana split eating contest during the 4<sup>th</sup> of July Celebration. In Columbus this type of thing would not be acceptable, however he does not object to this kind of activity. It is his intention to be community oriented and plans to associate publicly with the community.

In Afghanistan he worked with the local law enforcement. The biggest problem with the Afghanistan police, it is built around bribes. If you could pay, you get away with breaking the law. For example at a road check point, one group might get thru ok, but the next group would not.

However the Afghans are starting to trust the courts, which is new to the Afghan people. The police do a good job with very limited facilities, like being able to collect fingerprints. He was stationed at Paktika in the southwest part of Afghanistan on the Pakistan border. The area was similar to

West Virginia. The base he was stationed at, was about 200' x 600' and was next to an Afghanistan base. He was involved with intelligence on the Internet with the Afghanistan forces. To communicate they had to use interpreters. Chief Caskey was not sure all the time that what the interpreter was telling him was factual and vice versa to the Afghan soldier, because he felt the interpreter did not want to upset either Chief Caskey or the Afghan soldier.

When he left Afghanistan in July, he missed his son by eight hours, who was beginning his tour of duty in Afghanistan.

He is pleased to be in Granville as the Chief of Police. He reiterated his desire to be a public figure, and to have two way communications with people and organizations in the community.
