### **COMMUNICATIONS / ANNOUNCEMENTS**

1. Thanks to Lesa Miller for sending the post cards to our members announcing the return to the Granville Inn for our Monday meetings.

**PROGRAM**

Verdie Abel of Licking County Recycling located at 777 E. Main St. Newark, Ohio 43055.

Verdie is 1 of 2.5 staff. They are responsible for coordinating collection of recyclables countywide.

There are 85 bins at 22 locations countywide. Licking County has a population of roughly of 155,000 people and they recycle four (4) million pounds of recycled material. About 95% of the collected material is recyclable. However, unrecyclable materials can contaminate 6% of that 95%. Recycling is a very volatile hi-tech process and the value of the materials fluctuate a lot on the free market. Rumpke collects and markets the products for us.

In 2014 we collected 4,000 tires, 3,000 gallons of paint, 9,000 lbs. of electronic equipment (small equipment only no ref, stoves, or TV’s etc.) 112,000 computers. Universal Paint collects all of the paint reconstitutes it and resells it publicly.

There are special events going on such as your goal of 0 waste from the 4th of July and OSU. OSU is zero (0) waste. They have volunteers that sort through the trash.

They are promoted special projects such as the River Round Up and a booth at the Hartford fair.

They have extra bins at the Newark Library and Hoback Park that collect business paper only. The Green Team group empties these bins.

There will be a day camp “Recycling and Conservation Day Camp” for youths 6 -10 years of age at the Infirmary Park

on S.R. 37. The times will be 9 AM -3PM on June 22<sup>nd</sup> (Mon.) &23<sup>rd</sup> (Tues.).

Challenges:

- Create our “Brand”.
- Recycle difficult materials such as: Batteries, Feed & Agriculture bags, and Household Hazardous Waste (HHW).
- Composting - 30% of compostable materials go the landfill dumps. These materials do not decompose because of the structure of the landfills. The landfills are designed to keep water and oxygen out, therefore no materials will rot and decay. A landfill in Columbus is 700 acres and 500 feet deep. Owens Corning has its landfill in Newark and probably our nearest public landfill is in Perry County operated by Waste Management.
- Recruit volunteers.
- Reaching school age Youth, especially older Youth.

**Possible Committee Project**

Verdie at the end of his program asked us if Granville Kiwanis would be interested in supporting an essay contest in the Licking County School STEM Programs involving the 8<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> grades. This would involve environmental skills and journalism types and be open to anyone in the Licking County Schools.

The topics would involve the “Science of Recycling, “Ecology of Recycling”, and “Economics of Recycling”. Scholarships (he can’t use the word prizes) could involve all the Licking County Kiwanis Clubs. Twelfth graders could receive: 1<sup>st</sup> place \$500, 2<sup>nd</sup> place \$300, and 3<sup>rd</sup> place \$100 for a total of \$1,000. Eight graders thru the eleventh grades could receive savings bonds in the total amounts of \$400. To start this essay a funding of \$1,400 would be needed.

They have installed a new sign at their office, which is made completely of recycled materials.
