Newark Kiwanis Meeting

I attended their meeting on June 8<sup>th</sup>. Their program was about an effort by fifth graders to assist in getting the earthworks in Ohio listed as a World Heritage Site. The program was conducted by six students from Ms. Mary Borgia class from the McGuffey Elementary School in Newark. There were 3 taller students and 3 not so tall students. I only mentioned this because they stood behind the podium. Three you could see their faces and three you could only see from their nose up. *I probably shouldn't say it but it reminded me of the Kilroy drawings from the war.* There was no amplification for their voices nor did the power point presentation work.
