Who are we? Kiwanis is a global organization of volunteers dedicated to improving the world one child and one community at a time.. The K family organization supports all age groups - Circle K (college), Key Club, Builders Club, K Kids (to elementary), and Aktion Clubs (the disabled). We sponsor two (2) Key Clubs - Granville High School and Watkins Memorial High School and a Builders Club at the Granville Middle School.

What do we do? For fund raisers we: (1) rent tents, tables, chairs and a stage, (2) tap maple trees to make maple syrup, (3) have pancake day, which is scheduled for 2/13/16 at St. Edwards Church, (4) have the 4th of July Celebration Which is scheduled for 7/1/16 Fri. thru 7/4/16 Mon., the Granville Community Foundation provides the fireworks, (5) have a 5K/10K Maple Leaf Race held at the Granville Intermediate School and (6) Christmas Tree sales at Fackler Country Gardens and we include delivery.

What else do we do? For projects we: sponsor a Cub Scout Pack, Babe Ruth Baseball team, and Boy Scout Troop 65

Take & sell tickets at the H.S. Basket Ball games,

Planted 700 Maple Trees at Spring Valley Salt Run in 2008, Arrange visits for elementary students to the Sugar Shack for the students to see how Maple Syrup is produced, Don Lewis gives a presentation “Backyard Maple Syrup Making” at Dawes Arboretum, Show students at Welsh Hills School how their Maple trees at their school are tapped to collect sap water.
