Many clubs are considering applying for individual 501(c)(3) status using the 1023 EZ application. The handouts from that breakout will be helpful if we are considering making that step. There is a \$400 fee that you pay to the IRS to be able to apply. The clubs that have already applied have all been successful and have gotten their determination letters back very quickly.
