I attended Governor-Elect training in the spring. One of the presentations was on "Mission/Purpose Driven Optimist Clubs". I learned that our organization will grow when we share with others the true benefits of membership in an Optimist Club. For years we have talked about how Optimists "Bring Out The Best In Kids". And for this to happen we should not start with what we do or how we do it. We need to first focus on why we are Optimists.

Simon Sinek is the author of the book "Start With Why". He states "People don't choose your organization because of what you do. They choose it because of *why* you do it." By starting with "Why?" we touch peoples hearts and inspire them.

An example used in training was Martin Luther King Jr.'s "I Have A Dream" speech. The reason the "I Have A Dream" speech was so effective is it gave us the why we would all want equal rights for everyone. We all want our children to be judged by their actions, not the color of their skin. Just speaking about the philosophical or Constitutional reasons for equal rights does not motivate people to work for change. The "How" was rallying supporters who shared his Dream. People were inspired by the why, they rallied in great numbers to advocate for change. The "What" or result was the passage of Civil Rights Legislation. People were inspired because "I Have A Dream" and not "I Have A Plan". Purpose driven leaders invite those who share their dreams to join them.

So how does this relate to our organization? What is the purpose of our clubs and members? Our "Why" is to promote Optimism as a way of life. Our "How" is by serving children, our communities and our members to be THE BEST they can be. And our "What" is by providing service through various projects as well as self-improvement for our members.

So here is the value of being a member of our organization:

the World

- "Engagement—Taking Action to Build a Better Future
- "Relationships—Making Friends that Share your Optimism

Michigan District Policy Changes

At the Michigan District Optimist Convention there were a number of proposed Policy changes that were presented to the delegates for consideration. The following is an overview of the action taken by the delegates:

- The forward of the policies was amended to include most of Section 1A from the current policies
- For an individual to serve as Governor of the Michigan
 District they must have served a full term as a Club President and a majority of a full term as a Lieutenant Governor
- The District Historian shall keep the minutes and records of the District along with the District Secretary-Treasurer
- The policy for the District to have a separate budget for the District Convention was deleted as the Convention budget is already part of the part of the annual District budget

- The District Reserve Fund will have an amount not to exceed \$10,000
- The five Areas for the Oratorical Contest will be determined by the County that a club is in
- The proposed policy on Club Fundraising at District Meetings was referred back to the Governance Committee

As an informational item, the Michigan District Policy Committee will now be known as the Michigan District Governance Committee.

The revised District Policies will be printed in the Michigan District Directory and will be available on the Michigan District website (http://www.michiganoptimists.org/resources/ policies.html).

As with any construction project, there are steps to take as you build a new club including conducting a needs assessment; recruiting new members; conduct meetings with the potential members; follow-up / communications with those interested and then chartering the club.

Why do we care about building new clubs? Probably the most important thing to remember is that for every new member recruited we can help about 33 children in the area so if we build a new club with 25 members we can help an additional 825 kids in the targeted area. It's all about the kids!

We are here to help you with your building project. We have the supplies you need including training materials; draft press releases; new member orientation information, etc. We have also created a New Club Building team across our District who are here to help your efforts including Charlie King, Pat Rabaut Miller and Dave Fries in SE Michigan; Wilma VanLoo and Tedd Dotts in Western Michigan and Mary Aubin and Chuck Snyder in northern Michigan. We welcome any members who have a passion for New Club Building – just let us know. Please join us on November 7th during the 1Q meeting in Troy

to learn all about the steps to plan for and build a new club. In the mean time, as Petula Clark sang, "Call me (us), Don't be afraid, you can call me (us)...

Finally, I would like to urge each Club to appoint a Club Foundation Representative (CFR). This Member would act as a liaison between me, the Club and the Foundation, and would provide information and updates about the Foundation and District funds raised.

As always, thanks to each of you for your support of the Foundation. It is extremely important that we continue our fundraising efforts.

Also, I would like to ask as many clubs that want to,to bring a basket full of "goodies" representing their service area, that could be auctioned off, to raise money for the foundation. As Optimist clubs are planning for the 2015-2016 Optimist year, please consider an Oratorical Contest. You may have a student in your community that could win \$22,500 in scholarships.

Optimist International is adding two new competition levels to the Oratorical Contest in 2016. One winner of the Michigan District contest will win \$2,500 and will go on to compete in a Great Lakes Regional competition with a winning prize of \$5,000. If a Michigan student wins the Great Lakes Regional, he or she will go to St. Louis, MO on June 23 to compete in the International Oratorical competition and compete with other Regional winners for a scholarship prize of \$15,000

So how do clubs get started. Download the Planning Guide and contest application from www.optimist.org/e/member/scholarships5.cfm.

This year's topic is "**How My Best Brings Out the Best in Others**". Clubs that hold a local Oratorical Contest give young

people a chance to speak about their opinions regarding the world they live in, an opportunity to earn scholarship funds, and introduce the club to the community, parents, schools and youth.

It is not too early to meet with the school district or private schools and introduce them to the Oratorical Contest.

At the November conference, send your club Oratorical chairperson to the breakout session on the Oratorical Contest. Download the You Tube video on the OI site and ask your local public access television to run it to help create awareness of the Oratorical contest.

Clubs should plan to hold their Oratorical Contest by mid March 2016. Winners of those contests will go to the Michigan Regional contests in April, followed by the District contest.

Michigan District - Optimist of the Year


