**YCPO (Young Children Priority One)**

Programs that address the needs of children age 0-5 – focusing on maternal and child health, childcare and development, safety and pediatric trauma and parent education and support. A couple of items include: rubber duck to check temperature of water for baby; safety covers of electrical outlets; stuffed animals for kids in hospital; sewed dolls for kids;

**RAW – (Read Around the World) (formerly RIF – Reading Is Fundamental)**

Program to provide books to elementary students – we support this – although once again the school is making this more difficult;

**ELIMINATE** – (International project) to completely rid third world countries of Maternal/Neo-Natal Tetanus)--Raised \$61,531,000 to date worldwide –



The New England/Bermuda District has raised \$596,444.00 (\$115.96 per member) 5-year project in its 4<sup>th</sup> year right now...

The Dover-Foxcroft Kiwanis has contributed approximately \$2600.00 to the Eliminate Project and awarded two **Zeller Medals** (valued at \$1250.00 donation per each). One to Doc Sherman and one to Rita Page for their work with Eliminate project and humanitarian deeds.

## The Floating Hospital for Children & KPTI

For those of you who are new to Kiwanis here is some background information about the Floating Hospital and KPTI what they do and how Kiwanis became involved with Tufts Medical Center. There is also some information on how you can support KPTI.

Tufts Medical Center is a world-class, not-for-profit, 439-bed academic medical center that is home to both a full service hospital for adults and the Floating Hospital for Children. Located in downtown Boston, the Medical Center offers comprehensive inpatient and outpatient services for adults and children and is the principal teaching hospital for Tufts University School of Medicine. Tufts Medical Center is the oldest permanent medical facility in New England and one of the first hospitals in the nation.

The Floating Hospital for Children began as a hospital ship that sailed Boston Harbor from 1894 to 1927. Reverend Rufus Tobey believed fresh air, especially sea air, was beneficial to good health. He established Boston Floating Hospital, with a boat full of sick children, their mothers and siblings in July of 1894. The care was free and by the end of the first season more than a thousand children had been treated. Today the floating hospital provides a full range of inpatient and outpatient services in every area of medical specialization offering state of the art care to children from all parts of the region. The Floating is also home to the Kiwanis Pediatric Trauma Institute since 1981, certified as a Level 1 pediatric trauma center by the American College of Surgeons.

## Kiwanis Pediatric Trauma Institute (KPTI)

New England District Kiwanians began KPTI in the late 1970's to serve the children of New England and the world with a comprehensive, long-term commitment.

Dr. Harold "Hap" Gerrish, a dentist from Dover-Foxcroft, Maine and long-time Kiwanian, presented the idea of a center for medical treatment, research and safety outreach programs to Tufts Medical Center / Floating Hospital for Children, and in 1981, the Kiwanis Pediatric Trauma Institute, the world's first pediatric trauma center, was founded.

KPTI is a non-profit, tax exempt organization. The programs and services provided by the institute are supported by: Kiwanis Foundation of New England, Tufts Medical Center, GenReCorporation, The Boston Foundation, New England District of Key Club, and New England District of Circle K and by donations from corporations, foundations and individuals.

## Hap Gerrish Kiwanis Pediatric Trauma Registry

An outgrowth of Kiwanis commitment to KPTI, the Hap Gerrish Pediatric Trauma Registry enables any interested health care professional in the world to submit data and participate in the process of investigation of all aspects of childhood injury. This knowledge base, in concert with a growing, international data registry provides a unique new system of clinical decision support for pediatric care.
