FEBRUARY 21, 2015: Attendance include about 24 Bowlers and 36 caregivers including -

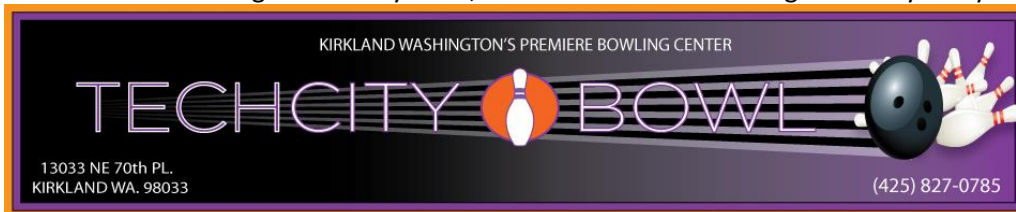
Kirkland Aktion Club President: Sean Mc Kibben, Vice President: Jeffrey Rohrback, & Secretary Courtney Schwartz.
