2017-18 Club Officers: Pres Reed McGrath, Vice Pres Jeremy Carrigan & Sec Corey Gilman.

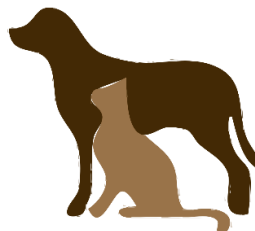
