Secretary **Dave Booker** announced that over a quarter of the club still has not paid dues, which were due July 1. Since the club has to pay dues to Kiwanis International for all registered members on October 1, anyone who has not paid dues will be dropped from the club at the next board meeting in September.

Secretary **Dave Booker** reminded us that it's time to choose our three delegates for convention. The incoming President and Secretary are designated as two of them, so **Linda Ellis** and **Dave** will be delegates. **John Brownrigg** was elected as Delegate 3. Since **Dave** is a delegate-at-large, his alternate will also vote; **Lyndon Ellis** was elected to that position, Alternate 2. **Joe Behson** was elected alternate for delegate #1 and **Janet Maleki** for delegate #3.

KI is asking every club to make a report to its members reviewing the club's donation to the Eliminate Project. **Bill Whipple** provided copies of the spreadsheet showing Project Eliminate donations and pledges of the clubs of the Van Rensselaer Division. Sand Lake Kiwanis donated \$33,842.63 of the VR total of \$41,900.05; that's 81%. That is \$615.32 per member, which got us both the bronze banner patch (\$250 level) and the silver (\$500 level). **Dave Booker** explained that in order to reach the



Model Club status all we would need to do would be to pledge to donate an additional \$7,407.37 over the next five years, which we would accomplish in our normal course of business with spaghetti suppers, etc. Since that is a multi-year commitment our bylaws require a vote by the club membership. The motion for that commitment, made by **Bob Pasquarelli** and seconded by **Pat Lane** and **Eve Ward**, passed.

SECRETARY'S MINUTES Accepted as submitted

TREASURER'S REPORT shows income from dues, which will go out by October 1. Treasurer Bob Pasquarelli pointed out that SummerFest income is almost entirely from donations and rides. The other activities are primarily for community benefit.

HIGHLIGHTS OF COMMITTEE REPORTS

CLUB BULLETIN: Five members volunteered 30 hours preparing the four July *Sandpipers*.

CLUB MEETINGS: 10 members volunteered 14 hours

COMMUNITY SERVICE:

Doors of Hope: Seven members unloaded 8,000 lbs. food pantry items, 11 hours.

Community Lettered Signs: One member spent two hours lettering the sign for the pasta dinner.

INTERCLUB: Five members and five guests attended the July 13th fifth annual Van Rensselaer Division Theater and Tailgate Outing at the Theater Barn in New Lebanon. Three members and four guests attended the VR Division EMNT fundraiser at the Valley Cats game on July 17. One member participated but could not attend.

MEMBERSHIP & EDUCATION: A prospective member attended his second meeting and was given membership information.

PROGRAMS: One for each of the four July meetings.

PUBLIC RELATIONS: One article in the *Advertiser* reporting the results of the SummerFest tennis tournament.

SENIOR SERVICES: Three members spent ten hours assisting residents of Brookside Senior Citizen Housing in packing, moving and unpacking their possessions while their apartments were renovated.

SOCIAL COMMITTEE: One member coordinated the club's annual social outing to the Valley Cats game.

SPIRITUAL AIMS: No report submitted.

SPONSORED YOUTH: No activity for K-Kids or Builders Club, as school is not in session. The Key Club Advisor reports that he hosted a meeting/cookout with the Key Club President and eight members to discuss activities for the upcoming school year. They would like to be more involved in Kiwanis activities.

WAYS & MEANS:

Pasta Dinner: 11 members volunteered 42.5 hours working at the pasta dinner fundraiser for Eliminate, serving 41 meals and raising \$186.44.

YOUNG CHILDREN PRIORITY #1: No reported activity for July.

YOUTH SERVICES: No reported activity.

OLD BUSINESS:

Food Trailer Design Contest: Tabled until the fall.

Donation to an Organization Working with Autism: Pat Lane has contacted our schools to find out what programs they have, and how we could help them meet their needs. There is not a separate class for autistic children, but they are served through other special classes. Pat has received permission to visit the class, and the personnel would be glad to come and do a presentation at SLK. iPads were specifically mentioned to assist in communication.

Directors and Officers Insurance: Action tabled until determination by KI whether this will be required as proposed for North American Clubs.

Donation in memory of Past President Dudley Dorr: The committee has met twice and is in the process of structuring a donation to take into account the wishes and recommendations of Dudley's widow, Rose Dorr.

NEW BUSINESS

New Pasta Dinner Project: The WSL Fire Department will be having a training session on the scheduled date of the next SLK Eliminate pasta dinner. A motion was made and passed to instead serve a pasta dinner to the firefighters as a community service, with funds of about \$100 to come from Community Service.

Funding for School Supplies for Needy Students: A motion was made and passed to donate \$1000 for this project, to be administered by Eve Ward.

Purchase of a DYD Foundation Raffle Ticket: A motion was made and passed to purchase a \$100 raffle ticket for an automobile. There was cursory discussion of what we would do with the prize if ours was the winning ticket of the 500 to be sold.

Dues Collection Report: Secretary Dave reported that he will send reminder letters to the 9 members who still have not paid their dues. One additional member has made arrangements for a payment plan.

Appointment of an Honorary Member: A motion was made and passed to designate **Ken James** an Honorary Member in recognition of his many years of dedicated service to the Club, and his increasing difficulty in attending meetings. This would mean that he would be welcomed at meetings as always and able to participate in all Club activities, but he would not pay dues and his absence would not count against Club statistics.

Other New Business:

Go-to Guide has provided a report based on 17 responses to a short questionnaire they provided.

Tent Requests: Two for the same dates, the weekend of September 6. Stu will get the older one, and Salem United Methodist Church will get the newer one for their fair.

DIVISION NEWS: There will be officer training this month, but dates have not been set.

DISTRICT NEWS: The office of Governor Elect was contested, but one of the two candidates has withdrawn.

INTERNATIONAL: For the first time, in 2015-2016 both the International President and President Elect will be females.

MOTION TO PAY BILLS AND ADJOURN: Made and passed.
