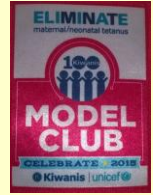

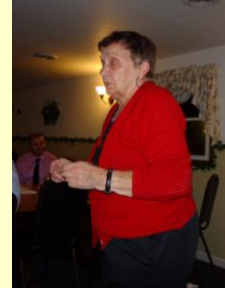

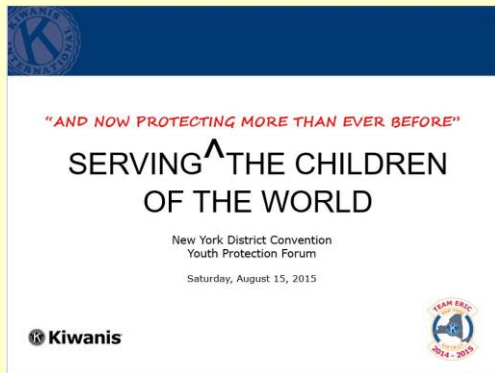

## PROGRAM



Secretary David Booker gave an illustrated talk (thanks to NYD Youth Protection Chair Jim Mancuso) on the Youth Protection Guidelines for Kiwanians. This is done annually to keep up our awareness of the liabilities of working closely with many young people. Every Kiwanian chaperone/advisor who works regularly with any of the Kiwanis youth organizations must submit to a background check, which is valid for ten years. Child abuse takes several forms: physical, sexual, and emotional. If you suspect any type of abuse, or if a child tells you about it, report it to the proper authorities; don't

try to do anything about it yourself. Trust your instincts, but go through the chain of command: school principal, or law enforcement. Don't call parents; let person in authority do that. All information is confidential! When chaperoning groups, the rule is one male chaperone for every 10 boys, and one female for every 10 girls. Well intentioned Kiwanians must also think about protecting themselves from any suspicion. When travelling by car, there should always be 2 adults in the vehicle. Do not dispense any type of medication to a child. There should be no alcohol at any youth function, and of course no drugs of any kind. Dave answered several questions. **Doors of Hope** (Ginther): 10,021 lbs food unloaded & stored (2 deliveries)

**Lettered Signs** (Whipple): 3 events: BSA bottle drop off, Church rummage sale and our monthly Pasta Dinner

**Sponsored Youth** (Fioravanti/Mulligan/Malecki/Nippes/Ellis, Linda): attended one K-Kids meeting; Kiwanis Builders Club advisor met with faculty advisor to plan the year; Key Club meeting cancelled due to flooding.

### **Ways & Means** (Ellis, Lyndon):

**Pasta Dinner** (Loveridge): Served 46 dinners, income \$278.52

**Young Children Priority #1** (Loveridge): Arranged for tour of AMC PICU/NICU by new NY District Governor and First Lady

**Youth Services** (Lane): Purchased school supplies, sorted by grades & schools, and delivered them to 3 elementary schools and middle school.

### **NEW BUSINESS**

1. Approved the Administrative and Program Budgets. Need new fundraising projects to finance the Community Services Committee, Youth Services Committee and Service Leadership Committee because their expenses are rising. Discussed 2 fundraisers: Citrus Sales needs more participation from members. Price to remain at \$23/carton. Christmas Tree Sales will be terminated (too many others selling, poor participation by members, fewer trees sold each year).
2. Approved Memorial Day and Labor Day as official “non-meeting” dates.
3. Approved purchase of 5 “Lawn Signs” for Pasta Dinners at a cost of \$164.20.
4. Creation of membership recruitment poster was postponed until next meeting.
5. Approved \$200 to sponsor an APHS sophomore at the HOBY seminar.
6. Re-approved the following Senior Members: Joe Grillo, Dale Hall, Frank Breselor, Dick Johnsen, Angelo Patti, Bruce Perry, George Raneri, and Bill Whipple.
7. Donation to American Cancer Society: voted to add \$130 to Food Trailer receipts of \$370 at the Relay for Life to make a donation of \$500.
8. Approved the use of the Hot Dog Steamer by Jim Colabelli Dec 5<sup>th</sup> at the Church of the Covenant Christmas Bazaar.
