John Brownrigg: I have 4 extra shirts, and since so many sizes have been mixed up, I will take orders next week—LAST CALL!

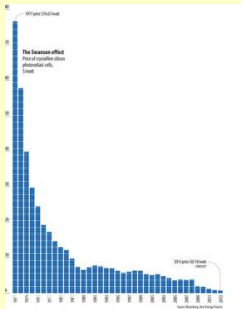

PROGRAM



Craig Daniels introduced **Kevin Carpenter** who gave an illustrated talk on *Solar Energy*. There are two types of solar energy: electric, which produces power, and thermal, which produces heat for either air or water. The major benefits of solar energy are many: saves money because it produces power from a free source, the sun; it allows less dependency on fossil fuels, and it reduces greenhouse gases. The cost has dropped considerably since it was first introduced in 1977. State and federal regulations favor solar energy. There is no state sales tax; no raise in assessment for 15 years; there is a .90/watt grant from NYSERDA; state tax

credit of 25% cap at \$5000 for 5 years; and a federal 30% no cap for 1 year. Using an example of an average home for 4 people with all electric appliances, Kevin showed an installation price of \$22,500, with credits of NYS rebate of \$4500, NYS tax credit of \$4500, and federal tax credit of \$5400, leaving a net cost of \$8100 for the solar energy system. The procedure usually begins with a technical survey to see if the home is suitable. Does it receive enough sunlight to produce power from a reasonable installation of solar panels? How much shading is there, from

trees or tall buildings nearby? What are the home's present electric bills? Both on the ground and aerial surveys are taken. A reversible meter must be installed to record both positive and negative power usages. If more power is generated than is used, credit is given by the power company; if not enough is generated, such as at night or on very cloudy days, the homeowner is billed for the kilowatts used. The installer does all the paper work, including securing the

necessary permits from various agencies. Most units are on roofs, but Kevin showed installations on other buildings, in yards, with some able to rotate to face the sun. Many questions were asked, among which were what happens during a power outage (storm or accidental downing of lines)? You still have an outage, because it would be very dangerous to the workers who are repairing the breakage if the lines were live. Kevin spoke briefly about

solar thermal hot water systems, which provide 50% to 80% of the demand, based on an 80 gallon tank, which is heated repeatedly as it cools. He welcomed more questions at the end of the meeting, or by email at treeguy@taconic.net. Pete Stevens thanked Kevin for a most informative talk about a subject that is a common topic among homeowners, and presented him with our Certificate of Appreciation.
