

Visit real ghost towns and those barely hanging on to life, such as Elkhorn, Montana. This is the real Wild West, where some of the stories are even wilder than the fictional accounts that were inspired by them.

In the mother lode country of California, luck played no favorites and Chinese laborers uncovered fortunes. Via narrow gauge railroad and jeep trail, climb high into the Rockies and San Juan Mountains of Colorado. Colorado's Hanging Flume was chiseled into 10 miles of sheer, red rock cliffs and still holds fast, dangling hundreds of feet above the Dolores River.




Out of the somber gray limbo that fills the screen, a mountain appears through the mists ... a mountain in the heart of the Grand Canyon. The Canyon comes alive with creatures large and small: cougar, mule deer, big horn sheep, desert tortoise, and the rare kiabab squirrel.

Descending into the Canyon by mule, we glimpse ghosts of the "ancient ones", the Anasazi, and chance onto a flash flood. Shaman's Gallery, thought to predate the time of Christ and never before filmed, is shown. A mountain lion pursues mule deer, a king snake captures a cactus mouse, and desert shrimp appear in a pond that has been dry for months. This great National Park offers life in astounding fullness. It can remain a part of your life for the rest of your life ... as it has for many, many people.

DALE JOHNSON has done filming for NOVA, the BBC, and the National Geographic Society. He spent two years filming the television series "The Lone Star Sportsman" from Dallas, and five

years working with the NASA program. He currently resides in Lubbock, TX.



High on the eastern shoulders of the tallest mountains in the world—The Himalayas—sits a tiny kingdom known as Bhutan. It is a landlocked nation with India on three sides, while Tibet lies to the north.

Bhutan broke away from Tibet in the 8th century and disappeared into the mists of her mountains. For eleven centuries it was closed to outsiders and nearly forgotten. Buddhism and its reverence for all living things permeates every facet of Bhutanese life. The air is free of pollution, crime is nearly nonexistent and smiles greet you everywhere. Electric lights (1994), television (1999) and cell phones (2003) will most assuredly end the isolated innocence that so many cherish. Rather than worry about the Gross National Product, this land proudly promotes what "The Gross National Happiness."

TOM STERLING has produced several tour films for the Canadian Broadcasting Company, PBS and The Discovery Channel. His films have been seen

Our adventure begins at the storied White Cliffs moving westward along the southern English coast through Brighton, Battle, Poole, and Plymouth, and walking the SouthWest Coast Path to Land's End.

Other stops along the way include the world's smallest active railway; the old Naval shipyard at Portsmouth; Queen Victoria's country palace, and St. Michael's Mount.

The final leg of the French voyage takes us to the Celtic wonderland of Brittany, including visits to the seafaring towns of St. Malo and Roscoff, and many a French Market.

We also visit lands within in the Channel: Brownsea Island for the birds, and the peaceful Isle of Wight. Guernsey and Sark in the Channel Islands, the only parts of Great Britain that were occupied by Nazi Germany.
