

EMMAUS KIWANIS ANNOUNCES SCHOLARSHIP WINNERS

The Kiwanis Club of Emmaus has announced the winners of the five scholarships currently awarded to graduating Emmaus High School seniors by the club.

The Walter Stoudt Memorial Scholarship was awarded to Barry Seng of Macungie. Barry will be attending the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill with a declared major in Economics. This award is based on academics, need and leadership in school and civic activities, including active membership in the Emmaus High School Key Club. The award honors the first president and co-founder of the Emmaus Kiwanis Club which was chartered in 1951.

The Warren Hamscher Memorial Scholarship was awarded to Jaclyn Reinbold of Macungie. Jaclyn will be attending Kutztown University, studying Communication Design. This award is based on academics, need, and demonstrated leadership in sports. The award honors the other co-founder of the Emmaus Kiwanis Club.

The Kiwanis Service Award was awarded to Robert Haag of Macungie. Robert will be attending Stanford University with a major in Engineering. This award recognizes Robert's wide range of service activities to his school and community.

The Larry Carraher Memorial Scholarship was awarded to Thomas Wagner of Allentown. Thomas will be attending the University of Delaware with a Chemical Engineering major. This award, chosen by the family of Larry Carraher, a past president and active Emmaus High School supporter, recognizes academics, need, and excellence in athletics.

The Donald Trump Memorial Scholarship honors the legacy of former Shoemaker Elementary teacher Donald Trump. It is awarded based on academics and need to a student who will attend a Pennsylvania public university, majoring in Education, which reflects Donald's values. This award went to Brianna McGinley of Macungie, who will be attending Bloomsburg University with a major in Special Education.

The Emmaus Kiwanis Club awards about \$6,000 annually in scholarship and other leadership grants to deserving students in the East Penn School District. Funds for these awards come, in part, from the revenues generated by the Club's annual Pancake Breakfast in June, Fruit and Pie sale in the fall, and other fund-raising activities throughout the year.
