HISTORY. Kiwanis was founded in Detroit, Michigan on January 21, 1915. The Kiwanis Club of Chippewa Falls was organized on April 21, 1919. Kiwanis is a worldwide service organization appealing to men and women who have the desire to become personally involved in improving the quality of life within their communities.
