First, I want to thank each of you for your hard work and commitment to Kiwanis. This year has been very exciting for me. I feel the Kiwanis passion in so many of you that I know exists in every club that I visit. The community leadership provided by the many Kiwanians I have met is truly invigorating. So as we prepare to attend International Convention I wanted to bring you up to date on the exciting news we have on several fronts.

eliMiNaTe - Kiwanis International held an Eliminate Project meeting in Indianapolis during the first weekend in May. The information was super and when the reward and recognition is explained in full detail you will see that we have something for everyone. A new medallion award, the Walter Zellar, will represent a \$1250 donation to the International Foundation, and the reason I mention this particular one is that those of you that want to be a Charter Zellar award winner must act by September 30. (Your personal budget may need as much time to react as possible.) It is not often that a Charter award is offered and I would hate for anyone to miss out. If you are interested in joining Doug and myself as charter members, please let me know. I received two other commitments from members in my club last week. I believe we will have several hundred Charter Zellars. KI has created other levels of giving; the overall program is exciting and I am sure that Elizabeth Tezza and Tom Dimmock will put on a great show at our District Convention to explain the many levels of giving. Of course those clubs that have \$2,000 ready to donate can receive special recognition at International Convention if you get your monies in by June 15.

CLO - Our goal for Club President and Secretary training is 100%. Just in case you are not aware of the timing, your club should have elected your new officers for the 2011-2012 year, and the annual new officer report should be filled out and submitted by June 1. That gives your club secretary about 5 days to complete. This information is important so that district leadership know who to call when we plan to visit your club meeting. Remember, any club officer can go to the KI website, watch the webinar and sit through the training at home, at anytime.

Growth - Sometimes it is doing the simple stuff like always having an application with you and asking someone to join you at a service project or meeting. Always ask your speaker to join, they may live somewhere else, but we need Kiwanians everywhere. At your next meeting, bring a stack of applications and send one home with every attendee and ask them to give it to someone they meet during the upcoming week. We are very close to breaking the negative membership trend and with a few new clubs and some positive reinforcement, we can be plus one. Please ask a new leader in your community to join. Membership retention is critical. Are new members asked to join in? What is their new idea? Club history and the Kiwanis organizational structure should be explained. Discuss available Kiwanis branded service projects that can be started in your community. Recruit new members to help serve in that program or event.

Service - If your club needs ten members to reach charter strength, take on a new service project involving children. Ask others to get involved and invite someone from that event to a Kiwanis meeting. For example, the director or VP of Pediatrics for the activity baskets might be a great new member. A new service project that has a K logo will help strengthen your club's visibility in your community.

Circle K - has started their new year as well and you can help by sending them to International convention. It is in Virginia this year so travel will not be as bad. Help us have a strong presence at convention.

Thank you for your commitment to serving the children of the world, one community at a time.

ARTICLE XX. AMENDMENTS Section 1. Amendments to these Bylaws, if in conformity with the Bylaws (8/18/07) of Kiwanis International (8/18/07), may be adopted by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the delegates and delegates-at-large voting at any convention. The District Secretary shall receive proposed amendments, which shall be submitted only by a club in good standing or by the District Board of Trustees, at least sixty (60) days prior to the date of the convention. The District Secretary shall send a copy of all proposed amendments to the secretary of each chartered club not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date of the convention.

International Convention Delegate Information

One of the most asked questions I receive as we get closer and closer to the International Convention is: what do I need to do to become a Delegate? Here is the short answer:

- 1) Clubs who are up to date on all payments are entitled to two(2) delegates. - However [the Delegate Form](#) must be completed.
- 2) Governors, Governors-elect, District Trustees, the District Treasurer, the District Secretary, Lt. Governors, Lt. Governors-designate, and Past District Governors who are active, privileged, or senior members shall be delegates-at-large to all International conventions. Delegates-At-Large do not need to fill out any paperwork.
- 3) Delegates-At-Large, should they choose to, can represent a club in their division that is not otherwise represented by two delegates from the club. In that case, [the Delegate Form](#) must be completed.

So, if your going to Geneva and want to vote in the house of delegates, make sure of two things:

- 1) All payments to Kiwanis International are up-to-date
- 2) You've completed [the Delegate Form](#) and sent it in.

Administration

Board Meeting Highlights

Secretary Moretz updated the board on the following International Board adoptions:

The Kiwanis International Board approved the pilot of an at-large membership classification for parents/guardians of SLP members. The fee would be \$15 (\$10 going to Kiwanis International and \$5 going to the district).

Club satellites that petition to become fully fledged Kiwanis clubs do not have to pay the new club chartering fee. In addition the newly chartered clubs would not receive the usual compliment of charter gift items (i.e. gong, gavel, banner).

An amendment to establish a club convention fee will probably be brought forward again for consideration at the 2012 convention in New Orleans.

The following locations were approved for upcoming MidYear Conferences & District Conventions:

- February 10-12, 2012 MidYear Conference: Myrtle Beach, SC Embassy Suites
- August 24-26, 2012 District Convention: Cary, NC Embassy Suites
- August 23-25, 2013 District Convention: Greenville, SC Embassy Suites
- February 7-9, 2014 MidYear Conference: Myrtle Beach, SC Embassy Suites

The board approved the District Secretary's Employee contract with minor rephrasing.

The board sent the idea of Key Leader/SLP Scholarships to the Strategic Planning Committee for further study.

Upon receiving the news that Trustee Trower would be leaving Region 2, the board approved her remaining as Region 2 Trustee through the August convention when a replacement trustee could be elected.

Dates for the September District Board of Trustees Retreat were set for September 16–17 in Lake Waccamaw, NC at the Anchorage Inn and the Boys and Girls Homes of NC.
