Kiwanis Values

In 1923 at the International Convention, Kiwanis President George Ross observed that the existing Kiwanis constitution was inadequate and needed to be revised. Upon approval, a committee was appointed and the revision of the Constitution was set in motion. At the second meeting of the committee, after observing that one of the Objects was even contrary to the Kiwanis service concept, work began on the wording of all six Objects.

The first Object originally read: "to emphasize the spiritual rather than the material values in human relations". The word 'spiritual' met with opposition. Past President Perry Patterson shared his thoughts. "I am sold on spiritual. My thought of spiritual has nothing to do with theology. My idea of spiritual is that

it refers to the qualities of character—like courage, imagination, integrity, vision, faith, hope. That is the only rational definition we can deal with."

All objections to the word 'spiritual' were eventually withdrawn and the committee went on to establish the wording of the First Object, "to give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than the material values of life." The wording of the first and the other five objects were established 88 years ago in their present form and continue to guide Kiwanis today.

Kiwanis Club of Morris turns 30!

The Kiwanis Club of Morris recently celebrated its 30th anniversary with great accomplishments. The club started in 1981 with an all-male membership, but it has changed to reflect a membership of nearly one-third female members. Working especially hard to increase membership and become even more involved with the community over the past three years, since 2009, they have inducted 12 new members including 6 members in 2011 alone. Morris's total membership is now up to 36!

In addition to a growing membership, they have also begun to increase its involvement within the community, and they have set a goal to host a community event and/or fundraiser each month. Some of activities and projects that the Kiwanis Club of Morris organizes and participates in throughout the year are:

- **Annual literacy event in February**—club members read to local grade school students and donate books to the classrooms.
- **Bowl for Kids' Sake event in March**—supporting the local Big Brothers, Big Sisters organization by bowling and donating funds.
- **Boy Scout Camp clean-up (Kiwanis One Day project)**—preparing the grounds for summer events.
- **Local food pantry assistance**—during the summer, they stock shelves and donate funds for a truckload of food.
- **Tri-Club steak fry event**—an event at a local park between the Morris Kiwanis, Rotary and Lions Club members.
- **August family picnic event**—held in place of one of their regular meetings, they host this fun event

where members bring their spouses and children along for food and fellowship.

- **Grundy County Corn Festival**—during September, they host a meal that serves as one of their main fundraisers. On the Sunday of Corn Festival, they host the annual Big Wheel Race where children of the area, ages 4–9, compete for a trophy and gift certificates.
- **Peanut Days fundraising in October**—this serves as their second fundraiser of the year.
- **Serve meals to the needy**—this is done through the St. Vincent's Table organization.
- **Holiday giving**—in addition to ringing bells for the Salvation Army, they adopt multiple families each Christmas to whom they provide gifts and a meal.

In addition to the events the club participates in or hosts, they donate approximately \$7,000 each year to nearly 20 organizations within the surrounding community.

As Kiwanians are aware, The ELIMINATE Project is a joint effort with Kiwanis International and UNICEF to eliminate maternal/neonatal tetanus (MNT) worldwide. MNT affects 39 developing countries and kills one baby every nine minutes. A series of three immunizations, costing just a total of \$1.80, will stop this disease.

The two clubs are reaching out to their local community to raise awareness of this killing disease and to raise donation funds. Members of the Tuscola Quilt Club made and donated this quilt to Key Club President Rachel Craddock to be raffled as a fundraiser for The ELIMINATE Project. 
Tuscola Kiwanis Recognizes Ward


