



# Endowment Programs

To better accomplish its Mission Statement into the future, your Foundation's Board of Directors established the La.-Miss.-W.Tenn. Kiwanis District Foundation Endowment Fund. The Endowment Fund is a restricted fund managed under a conservative investment and disbursement policy by the Board of Directors of the District Foundation. Now that the initial goal has been attained, dividend and interest earnings will be used to provide grants to clubs and the scholarship programs administered by the Foundation. But to retain the minimal limit - and to continue to grow the fund - the Foundation must continue to receive generous donations to ensure the Foundation's ability to assist clubs will be brought to a new, more substantial level for the future.

The **Henry W. Nash ~ Eugene J. Maier Tablet of Honor** is the highest honor the Kiwanis District Foundation could bestow, as the **Tablet of Honor** contributions can be made on behalf of an individual, club, corporation, or organization. Individuals cannot honor themselves.

Named after two of the District Foundation's original founding members, the Tablet of Honor provides a giving opportunity through which individuals, Kiwanis clubs, divisions, etc., can permanently honor or memorialize Kiwanians, their spouses and friends, their clubs or other organizations.


Recipients of the **Henry W. Nash ~ Eugene J. Maier Tablet of Honor** are presented an attractive engraved "tablet" signifying that a minimum contribution of \$1,000 has been made in their name.



**The River of Life Fellowship** is the basis of the LaMissTenn Foundation Endowment Fund, designed to allow participation by every member in the District. Contributors can make a one-time tax-deductible donation of \$1,000, or to pledge to donate that amount over a multi-year period.

Clubs also use the **River of Life Fellowship** as a way to honor outstanding members or club patrons.

Contributions of \$1,000 will be recognized with a framed print, which distinguishes the donor/recipient as a **"River of Life Fellow."**



**The John T. Roberts Fellowship** is named in honor of honors our District's first Kiwanis International President. During Roberts' year as President in 1982-83, clubs were challenged to motivate children to their highest potential and to improve the quality of life for those less fortunate.

The Roberts Fellowship is bestowed upon receipt of a \$1,000 contribution to the District Foundation by a member, a club or a division. New John T. Roberts Fel-

lows receive a medallion and a lapel pin.
