Governors, as well as the Growth team are working with Kiwanis International on the new growth plan which we hope will turn this around. We are looking for volunteers in each region to



be new club builders and club counselors. If you would be willing to learn more about these positions, please contact your Lt. Governors.

I want to say a special thank you to the twenty five clubs who ended the year with at least a plus 1 in membership. You are on the right path and I want to encourage you to continue doing what you are doing to grow Kiwanis.

One of my goals for this year is for 70% of the clubs to finish with a plus 1 in membership. To accomplish that, new members must be added in every club. We desire to add new members so that others can enjoy all the things that we presently enjoy about our Kiwanis experience. What can you do to share your love for Kiwanis with your friends and neighbors? Perhaps this would be a good time to think about what we love about our clubs. I am sure that everyone loves different things but for me, I love all that we do for the children such as helping with 4H Clubs, giving scholarships, distributing food to those in need, and raising \$10,000 each year to help the needy children and their families in the county with Christmas gifts. Monthly Club Reporting: Special thanks to the club secretaries for their excellent monthly reporting this past year. The information submitted is very valuable. Monthly Reports are submitted online by the 10th of each following month. Remember that this is not just the Club Secretary's job. A club secretary needs information to report, so be sure to keep them informed of your committee activities, etc.

The reporting program allows the club secretary to automatically send a preview of the monthly club report by email to the president, board members and others before submission. I would highly encourage you to do this. You may catch things that are not getting reported. The reporting program also allows the secretary to email the final monthly report to anyone in your club.

Does our club need to do an Annual Club Report??: Just a reminder, if your club completed all 12 of your monthly reports you <u>do not</u> need to complete a separate annual report. The Annual Report for each club will be automatically generated from the online monthly reports. Club secretaries can still modify any of the 2012-2013 monthly reports until November 30, 2013 if needed.

If you represent one of the few clubs that did not submit all 12 monthly reports online, then Kiwanis International is asking that you complete the online 2012-13 Annual Club Report which will be available November 1. This form allows clubs to report service and administrative activities online (electronically) for the 2012-2013 year. Clubs are asked to complete the report on or before November 30, 2013. Again, please note this report is only for those clubs that have not completed all 12 of the monthly reports. In the event that a club secretary is unable to access the Internet, please locate another Kiwanis member in the club who can assist. Kiwanis no longer provides a paper version of the Annual Club Report.

District Kiwanis Speakers Bureau

Let me be the first to congratulate your club on the great things done during the 2012-2013 Kiwanis year. Now we move on to even greater things for 2013-2014! As part of the excitement of starting a new Kiwanis year let me announce to your club a wonderful opportunity. The MN-DAK district has been working for over a year now to prepare a special, free service to all clubs in the district. Beginning today we have about 25 Kiwanians in the district who are prepared to be presenters to clubs at club meetings. We know that for many clubs, Kiwanis information is lacking at both the international and



district level. As new members join clubs they do not know much about the organization in most cases and a quick, one-time orientation day is not enough.

The speaker's bureau is offered to all clubs in the district. The list of topics available can be found at the end of this email. If you are looking for other Kiwanis topics let us know and we can probably provide something on that topic. Each presenter has expertise in the areas they select and will travel to your club as a guest presenter. They have prepared 20 minute presentations as most speakers are given that amount of time. We can't tell you who the speaker might be until after you request a speaker. At that time we will contact someone close to your club meeting and you and the speaker will work on scheduling. Speakers will be reimbursed for travel by the district as our officers and directors who visit clubs. We expect clubs to comp speakers for meals if your club has a meal as part of the meeting.

Or by phone: 507-304-1624. I will then contact a speaker in your area who can present on the topic selected by your club. Don't feel you can only request a Kiwanis speaker once a year. Feel free to request as desired up to once a quarter.

Here are the topics (feel free to suggest other topics):

- 1. Kiwanis Foundations and why should we donate? (International and District level)
- 2. What is the Eliminate Project and why should we be supporting this endeavor?
- 3. What does SLP stand for and why should we start sponsoring one or more?
- 4. What ways can our club improve our support for our existing SLP(s)?
- 5. What is Key Leader and how can our club get involved?
- 6. How can our club go about finding new service projects in town?
- 7. The importance of a club analysis and how to do one well
- 8. What kinds of service projects do other clubs in the district do? What is a signature project and how can our club attempt this?
- 9. Membership recruitment and retention ideas
- 10. The history of Kiwanis International and our District (interactive presentation)
- 11. Other topics?

If you are interested in having someone from the speaker's bureau present to your club simply contact me at least one month in advance of the date with the topic you are looking for. The district has made a large investment in this program in both time and money. We often hear from clubs that the district does not do anything for them. Here is a great opportunity to show your club that the district is interested in our clubs AND is willing to aid clubs in finding quality presentations for meetings.

Whatever you like about your club, membership makes it happen. International President Gunter Gasser has established the following membership goals for each club for 2013-14:

Every club should be at or above charter strength (15 members). Accomplishing this could mean recruiting

new members, focusing on retention of current members or forming a club satellite.

- 2. Every club with at least 15 members should strive to have a minimum net growth of one new member for the year.
- 3. Every region should identify at least one new club site and start opening at least one new club this year.

We all know the ways we can strengthen our membership, but now is the time for us to put all our efforts behind this campaign. Every club should have a membership committee that meets regularly and plans a strategy for bringing in members. Plan a membership drive. Ask your friends, neighbors, family members or business associates to join you in serving the community through Kiwanis. Most people are flattered to be

asked. Promote your club activities through the local media. Always include a name and phone number in the article where people can get more information about your club. Reconnect with former members. Those who left at one time because their work schedules or family schedules changed may be happy to rejoin. And don't forget to connect with former members of Key Club and Circle K International, or even with their parents.

As I said earlier, Kiwanis has declared a Campaign for Growth and is giving us the tools to succeed. I have been asked to serve as the MNDAK District Chair for this campaign. Planning for Japan

Great job getting your clubs (and spouses) to budget for your 2014 trip to Japan! The next thing you need to do is check your passport. The expiration date must fall *after* your return flight to the United States. These days, a renewed passport costs about \$110 while a new passport costs around \$135. Both take 4-6 weeks to process unless you would like to supply an extra \$60 to expedite the timeline.

Preliminary research suggests that visas are not needed for a short trip to Japan - but don't take my word for it! Look around online or call your favorite international travel agent to be sure you won't need a visa, a green card, or any other supplementary document for



entrance into Asia. What a shame it would be to spend ten hours flying to the Narita Airport, only to spend a few hours in the immigration office before catching the nine hour flight right back to the United States.

Don't worry about any unusual vaccinations, but be sure to stock up on vitamins before your crowded flights around the globe. The flight over the Pacific Ocean will provide meals for you, but pack a few snacks for the hours in between meals and for the days you are in the Asia-Pacific District. Food is easy to find and fairly affordable in Tokyo, but you may be glad to have a favorite package of crackers during the House of Delegates.

Last but not least: this is a good time to start brushing up on your Japanese culture. If you study nothing, you will be fine. However, if you would like to speak the local language, don't wait any longer to begin studying! Many resources are available for learning to read or at least speak Japanese. And next time you dine at a Chinese buffet, opt for the chopsticks - even down to the last grain of rice...




Until next time, please take a look at your clubs budget and see to it that there is a line item for the International Foundation.
