Club Election Reports: We are still missing some club election reports. If your club has not submitted your 2015-2016 club election report, please do so right away. The easiest and preferred way to submit the election report is for the club secretary to do it online. Even if you have the same officers as last year we need to know or we will not have the necessary information to communicate with your club. Also a reminder that if any of your reported officers change during the year, the club secretary can edit the club election report online at any time.

Monthly Club Reporting: Just a reminder to club secretaries and presidents that if you have submitted all of your 2014-2015 monthly club reports online, you will not need to do a separate Annual Report. All of the necessary information will already have been submitted via your monthly reports. Complete your September report by no later than October 10th. If your club has a new secretary, be sure that they get registered for the online reporting program. If you have questions about that, let me know.

Club Incorporation Reminder: All Kiwanis Clubs are or should be incorporated with their respective Secretary of State. Non-Profit Corporations such as Kiwanis Clubs are also required to file an annual renewal each year. The renewals are quite easy to do, but sometimes they slip through the cracks when officers change. Each state has a slightly different procedure so see the website for your respective Secretary of State for details. You can also check the status of you club renewals online.

See if your club information is current. Your club secretary can update your club meeting location online at anytime through the same portal that is used for monthly club reporting. 


Last but not least is the thriving metropolis of Toronto.

2015-2016 Club President serves his club at 97 years of age

The Kiwanis Club of Hendricks was established in 1961. The Club still plays a valuable role in this rural Minnesota town with a population of 713 according to the State provided entrance sign.

In the tradition of Kiwanis, new officers were installed by Lt. Governor Dennis Hier on September 21, 2015. However, it is believed that the new President, Chris Hoversten for 2015-16 is a unique man in many ways. One might say that he is a man who brings a rich history of life experiences to his new role. He was born on a farm east of Hendricks. He graduated from high



school at a nearby town. He attended Augsburg College on a football scholarship. Unfortunately, this choice caused a separation from his high school sweetheart.

After teaching high school for one year at a salary of 125 dollars per month, he became a salesman for Northrup-King. During this time "Uncle Sam" pursued him for a military career, but as it happened his draft status was changed five times ending with a 4F.

Then he moved to Minneapolis, Minnesota, where he started a forty year career with 3M which combined his chemistry background and interest in working with people. Soon he found himself back East for seven years developing and launching a company that brought "reflective" signs to the highways and license plates of America.

In retirement he and his wife enjoyed ten years in Savannah, Georgia. Missing being with family, they moved back to Minnesota living in Lakeville for another ten years. His desire to be closer to his roots caused them to move to Marshall. It was there his wife died.

As a single man it made sense to down-size moving to an apartment building. This must have been a divine appointment, because it turned out that one of the neighbors was his high school sweetheart. In time they were married and moved to Hendricks, Minnesota, where he became an active member of the Hendricks Kiwanis Club.

This year Chris, a 97 year old, will serve as President!

Jamestown Kiwanis to feed hungry children

Jamestown Kiwanis along with 400 volunteers are feeding the hungry. For the fifth time since 2011, Jamestown Kiwanis is coordinating a Kids Against Hunger meal-packaging



event. The event is set for Nov. 14. Fellow Kiwanians are asked to help. Packaging shifts are set for: 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. and 1 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the James River Valley Fitness (former YMCA).

"With the help of generous donors, our goal this year is to raise \$50,000, which is \$10,000 more than last year, said Janna Bergstedt, marketing manager for First Community Credit Union and past-president of Jamestown Kiwanis. So far, we're at \$38,000."

At prior events, volunteers came together from churches, schools, service clubs, small businesses and individual families, packaging more than 28,000 lbs of food. Meals include vegetables, vitamins, rice and soy. The packages are then distributed internationally, nationally, with local (North Dakota) distribution through Great Plains Food Bank feeding network.

"The last project in 2014, was a tremendous success, when the Great Plains Food Bank received and distributed 11 pallets (14,000 lbs) of food to hungry neighbors in North Dakota," said Ron Walters, Major Gifts Officer for the Great Plains Food Bank.
