These three clubs will also be acknowledged at the District Convention in Fargo this August. Let's make this a fun contest, and see how many new Kiwanians we can have by June 1.

Professional Career: I was employed by the Federal Aviation Administration for 33 years in the Air Traffic Control field retiring in June, 2002. I held controller assignments in facilities at all levels of complexity and volume including; Syracuse, NY; Chicago, IL and Cleveland, OH. I was a classroom and simulator instructor at Chicago Approach Control. I held Supervisory Air Traffic Control assignments at Akron, OH; Akron-Canton, OH; Cleveland, OH; and Boston, MA. I was a Facility Operations Specialist in the FAA, New England Region and the Assistant Air Traffic Manager at Bradley International Airport, Windsor Locks, CT and at Minneapolis-St. Paul International Airport. I spent the final six years with the FAA as the Air Traffic Manager of the St. Louis, MO Hub responsible for three Air Traffic facilities and two contract towers.

I have received the unanimous endorsement of the Kiwanis Club of Spring Valley in seeking the position of Governor Elect of the Minnesota-Dakotas District. I would consider it an honor and a privilege to serve as the Governor Elect and Governor of this great district. Century Club donations to the MN-DAK District Kiwanis Educational Foundation are currently lagging far behind the usual pace of giving during the Kiwanis year. Economic times are difficult for all individuals and clubs but our students need our scholarship help more than ever. Scholarships to be awarded by the MN-DAK District Kiwanis Educational Foundation for the 2010-11 college year have had to be reduced by \$50.00 per scholarship compared to the 2009-10 college year. This is due to a poor return on investments and decreased giving by clubs and individuals. 
Because its only function is providing scholarship funds for graduating High School seniors, the MN-DAK District Kiwanis Educational Foundation offers an on-going youth service project for every club.

CLUB BULLETIN/NEWSLETTER, 2010:

A club bulletin/newsletter is a periodical document that informs club members and others of news and happenings from within the club, region, district, and international organization that would be of interest to the reader. It will be judged in a number of areas, such as appearance, reports, programs, sponsored youth, service projects, activities, education, entertainment, etc.

Entries will be judged in the following categories:

White Category: 30 members or less

Blue Category: 31-45 members

Orange Category: 46-70 members

Silver Category: 71-100 members

Gold Category: 101 and over members

There will be one regional winner in each category in which there are any entries. Two copies of the winning entries will be sent on to the district for further judging.

Up to 3 district winners will be awarded in each category. The district will choose one "**Best Overall Club Newsletter/Bulletin**". Winners will be announced at the District Convention.

Entries must be sent to the Regional Administrative Director by June 1.

Send two (2) copies of each of three (3) issues of your club bulletin/newsletter to the person listed below for your region. Include club name, club size, region, and name, address, phone, and e-mail of a contact person for your club.

CLUB BROCHURE CONTEST, 2010:

A brochure is a document that is used to explain what a Kiwanis club is and does. It is used as an advertising and publicity tool, and contains general information about the club. It should be easy to read, attractive, and informative. Kiwanis International Objects should be included along with club goals and a history of service activities. Information must be accurate and up-to-date. Only one winner will be selected from each region. The district winner will be selected from the regional winners, and will be announced at the District Convention.

Entries must be sent to the Regional Administrative Director by June 1.

For the club brochure contest, send only one copy to the name listed below, and include club information (club name, region, and name, address, phone, and e-mail for a club contact person).

Hendricks Kiwanis sponsors Kids Against Hunger

On February 27th, the Hendricks Kiwanis Club sponsored the "Kids Against Hunger" program, which brought in a huge truck loaded with raw materials to fill into bags which will be shipped to Haiti to feed the hungry children. The food consists of fortified soy, rice, vegetables, chicken flavoring, vitamins and minerals. The club had been advertising the project for some time and had contacted many local organizations, clubs, churches, and businesses for support in funding and volunteering to help fill the bags.



The public responded wonderfully, as we had about 250 volunteers, including 16 Kiwanians, with ages from 2 to 96, to help that day, as well as about \$9500 in donations. There were 14,166 bags filled, each bag containing 6 meals, so almost 85,000 meals were packaged for Haiti. The cost of the materials was 15 cents per meal, or \$12,750. Our club donated \$3145 to pay for what the donations from others did not cover.

During the week prior to the event, local Kiwanians served samples of the rice product to the elementary students to encourage their families to participate in the packaging day.

We had hoped for 50,000 meals and 50 volunteers, but the public responded very well, not only from Hendricks but also the rural areas and surrounding communities. The people from Kids Against Hunger were amazed, saying there was nothing we could have done better. They are hoping for 1 million meals from the whole state of Minnesota, and our little town of 700 has already furnished over 8% of that total.




Vantine Life Fellowships- Nominations Requested

April 2010 Update

Just a reminder! Graduated New Member Fee Schedule Goes Into effect April 1st: The International Board has adopted a graduated enrollment fee schedule for new members. The new rates go into effect on April 1, 2010. This means clubs will no longer pay a flat fee of \$50 no matter when the new member joins. The fee will be based upon the date the new member is entered at KI. For example, if a member joins in April the new member enrollment fee will be \$36.00 to International plus the usual District new member fee of \$5.00. The district new member fee has been \$5 for many years and due to the relatively small amount will not be graduated. As before this schedule reflects when and how clubs are obligated to pay these fees to Kiwanis International. Each club decides how and when they collect dues from their own members.

New Online Member Management feature for club secretaries: Last month I announced that Club Secretaries can now add, delete and edit member information online. Once they enter the information it is instantly available to both Kiwanis International and the District Office. The club secretary and the district office receive an instant email confirmation each time an add or delete is made. Only club secretaries have access to the online data. In addition to adding and deleting members as they happen, club secretaries should be sure the contact information and email addresses are correct for your current members.

Once you enter a new member online you are able to immediately print out an enrollment fee invoice for the new member. At present you need to send that invoice along with a check to KI. In the near future you will also be able to pay dues and new members fees by credit card. Many clubs have asked for that.

During the last few weeks many club secretaries have used the new online system to add/delete/edit members. They have found it very easy and efficient to use. If you have not tried it, please do so. I know you will like it!

Club Elections: Just a reminder that your club election results will be due June 1st. Club secretaries should submit the club election reports online through the same KiwanisOne web page that we use for monthly club reporting.

Kiwanis International Convention- Las Vegas: Besides registering for the convention, be sure to report your club's two International Convention delegates and two alternates to the International Office by April 30 on the Delegate Certification Form. Be sure to send copy to the District Office. All club secretaries should have received the necessary forms, but if you need another copy you can find it on the Kiwanis International Convention website.

Lt. Governor Education Conference Planned: Governor Elect Lowell Disrud, along with the Lt. Governor team for the upcoming 2010-2011 Kiwanis year will be meeting April 30-May 2 in Fergus Falls. They will be learning more about their role on the district level and developing district plans and goals.

District Kiwanis Foundation Board and Past Governors Meeting: Both of these groups will be meeting May 14-15 in Fergus Falls.
