We were contacted in December of 2016 by Jackie Deal, a Kiwanian from New Mexico. She works for the National Solar Observatory. They are going to Glendo because that is Ground Zero for the US. The Eclipse will start in Oregon and end in South Carolina or Georgia.

Glendo is considered a dark sky area because there are very few lights within 50 to 60 miles. When the Eclipse happens Glendo should be the darkest anywhere in the US.

Glendo also has a 97% chance of clear sky's at that time of day.

Marty, Tim (and others) went to Glendo and checked out the location, selecting it because of the power we are going to need. Good power source.

YES, there will be medical at the north end of the airport.

Glendo only has a couple of restaurants so we are going to help with food. Glendo is expecting 75,000 to 125,000 people.

Park service for the state of WY has decided there is a limit of ppl allowed in the park. Once that limit is reached gates will be closed and the rest of the attendees will be pushed into the town of Glendo.

Our projected income is \$23,000 for serving 4,000 meals. 2000 breakfast and 2000 lunches.

The City of Glendo has been very accommodating. **Thank you Glendo.**

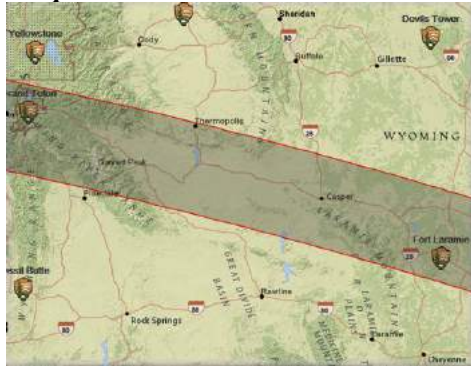

## Eclipse Path



The eclipse's path of totality will make its way through the entire **central region** of Wyoming as it spans **more than 365 miles**—from Torrington and Lusk on the east side of the state to Wilson and Jackson on the west side of the state—providing visitors the opportunity to see this natural phenomenon in some of the nation's most stunning landscapes. Areas and communities located directly under the

*path will experience the eclipse for approximately two-and-a-half minutes, while it will be viewable for a lesser duration of time in communities located roughly 30 - 50 miles from the center of totality, but still in the eclipse's path. Plus, this once-in-a-lifetime solar eclipse will pass over six Wyoming **state parks and historic sites** where astronomy experts will be on hand with telescopes to share insights and educational opportunities. With wide-open spaces, the lowest light pollution in the country and abundant public land access—as well as celebratory **festivals and events**—Wyoming is the perfect destination for viewing the eclipse.*
