Program



Mayor Marian Orr

First 32 days.

When Mayor Orr campaigned her talking points/goals were roads, taking care of what we have, neighbor problem areas, making the city work better for you.

6th penny ballot started out as the Capital Facility Tax. Mayor Orr spoke with council and reps from downtown and the chamber about core project and they decided they could find other funds and grants other than the 6th penny tax to take care of downtown projects and improvements.

5.48 million may be allotted towards city roads.

The Belvoir Ranch Cheyenne is 19,000 acers of land that may be utilized for a State Park with amazing trails. The Mayor's office is working to gain access to the Belvoir Ranch across UP Rail Road Tracks (this will take reasonable negotiations). 2.4

million is being considered for this project.

Mayor Orr is looking to allot 6 million to **fire stations for improvements**.

District Courts: The City of Cheyenne is in need of two new district judges and they will need space. The Mayor's office looked at several possibilities for a new location or renovating an old building. At this point it looks like there is going to be an 8 million dollar renovation of the current municipal courts building. A renovation instead of a new building will save millions.

The Mayor's office started looking at how many **junk cars are left/parked on city streets.** If the city confiscates the vehicles what do they do with them. The city is looking into how to deal with the problem.

City Offices - Business Friendly. The City of Cheyenne held a 3 day retreat where Mayor Orr and department heads looked at how to make our City Government more efficient. They found that many departments in Cheyenne have overlapping duties. The City of Cheyenne is going to reduce the amount departments from 16 departments to 6.

At an all-city meeting Mayor Orr announced that city workers jobs and wages are safe.

The new City Government Structure. Changes will not take effect until July 1, 2017.

- 1. Support Services
 - a. City clerk, finance, youth alternatives, municipal courts and support services
- 2. Operations
 - a. Transportations, solid waste, facilities, equipment, etc
- 3. Police

- 4. Fire
- 5. Community services
 - a. Recreation, special events and services, botanic gardens an civic center (adult softball, gymnastics)
- 6. Development services
 - a. Engineering, Planning
 Development,
 Greenway
 Development and
 Construction
 management.
