

Program



Tom Forslund, Director of the Wyoming Departments of Health and Family Services

In 2011 Mr. Forslund was appointed by Governor Mead as the Director of the WY Department of Health. Tom's term will end at end of 2018.

Divisions of the WY Department of Health Public Health Division Behavior Health Division Aging Division Health Care Financing Division

90% of WDH budget goes to providers (businesses) throughout the state of Wyoming. 10% goes to personal.

There are 1413 employees throughout state.

A Developing Problem in the State of Wyoming is the <u>aging of the</u> <u>population and the long term health</u> costs.

The highest portion of the states population are Baby Boomers and the smallest portion of the states population are Generation X.

The cost of long term care the State of Wyoming pays is going to go up from 130 million to 312 million dollars in the next 13 years.

5 major factors causing this increase.

- Aging population that is burdened with chronic disease. Between the years of 2017 to 2030 the population who are 65 years of age and older will increase by 56%.
- 2. Decrease in working population ration verses retired population.
- 3. A population that is unprepared to deal with long term health cost. 41% of households between the ages of 55 and 64 have no savings and 52% of households between 65 and 74 have no savings.
- 4. High and increasing cost of long term care. Today cost for a long term single private room is \$88,500 per year. (Share a room for \$79.000). Right now Medicaid pays for 64% of nursing home stays in Wyoming.
- Small and weakening insurance market. Prices increasing dramatically.

The Consequences are, we have a state of aging population that is not prepared to pay for long term

care. More people will have to apply for Medicaid.

What do we do:

Promote the aging population to stay in their homes as long as possible. The State of Wyoming is working with the Legislature to come up with more programs to assist the aging population.
