## What is PEO?

Did you know about PEO? PEO is a philanthropic educational organization of women dedicated to providing education and scholarships to women. We have 10 members of women in Columbine Kiwanis who are PEO members of various "chapters" in our area, and also 3 male members of our club who are married to a PEO. PEO was founded in 1863 in Iowa at Wesleyan College by a group of women. Since then we have grown to be an organization that encompasses Canada & the USA. Each state/province has chapters of women, and Colorado has 224 chapters ranging in size from 12 to over 50 members in each chapter. Why am I telling you about this? Because our board of Columbine Kiwanis approved the volunteer hours of PEO's work to raise scholarship money to give to women in our area of community service. Last weekend Chapter BS (6 members are in this Kiwanis club) had a Silent/Live auction at CUC on Saturday and we raised over \$3,500 for our Chapter and \$1,600 by selling our own Connie McLaughlin's scrumptious scone mix!!! BS has 45 members and we work together to raise money for both local and International scholarships. Overall the 10 women in PEO who belong to this Kiwanis club have given local scholarships to graduating senior girls in our area of over \$10,000 this past year alone and even more than that amount to our Int'l scholarship awards. We also own and run our 4 year women's college, Cottey College in Nevada, Missouri. We all work to provide money to fund this college and give scholarships to young women to attend. It has flourished for 123 years!!!! So I hope you have learned a little bit more about the women in our club who do more than just Kiwanis volunteer work. We love to help in the education of women of ALL ages through this valuable organization.

## Outdoor Lab

Rod and I had the opportunity to visit with Martha Shehan several weeks ago. She was not able to attend the Outdoor Lab presentation but asked two of her 6th grade teachers to attend, Tim and Lynn. At that time we presented a check of \$3750 to be split among 5 schools for Outdoor Lab scholarships. Lynn wrote the following for us.

Outdoor Lab is an opportunity for every sixth grader in Jefferson County Schools to attend a week long outdoor school. There are two sites; Mt. Evans outside of Evergreen,



and Windy Peak outside of Bailey. Each year, over 6,000 12 year-olds visit the sites. During the week they stay in cabins, or bunk houses, eat three family-style meals a day, and learn in an outdoor environment. They take classes in hydrosphere, biosphere, geosphere, initiatives courses, navigation, and astronomy. In addition, each site provides evening entertainment which could include guest story tellers, mammals programs, Hawk Quest, line dancing, musicians, or crafts. Most of this learning takes place on extensive and gorgeous trails throughout the Rocky Mountains. It is truly a hands-on experience, in all types of weather. The only time students come in off the trails is when there is lightning, other than that they are hiking 5-7 miles a day, and learning about their ecosystem the whole time.

Not only does this program impact sixth graders, but also high juniors and seniors who have the opportunity to become high school leaders. These young men and women give up a week of high school sports, classes, jobs, and social life to supervise sixth graders, as well as teach classes at both sites. They have a huge learning curve, but end up being amazing role models and have the opportunity to change lives. Many of them volunteer because they remember a fabulous high school leader that changed their life as a sixth grade.
