Meet Maggie Mainzer



Margarita Mainzer "Maggie" was born in Buenos Aires, Argentina in 1929. Her mother was born in Austria. Her father was born in Latvia. He lived and worked in Germany for a time before immigrating to Argentina. Maggie's Mother also immigrated to Argentina after the end of WWI, where she and Maggie's Father met and were

married. Maggie and her siblings spoke German at home, while also speaking the local Spanish language with friends and schoolmates. Following the advice of her Father, Maggie also studied and became fluent in the English language. She attended the Argentinian equivalent of our elementary, middle and High School in Buenos Aires. In 1956 Maggie met and married her husband, Herbert Mainzer.

In 1963 Maggie and Herbert moved to California with their six-year old daughter, Gabriela, and their four-year old son, Marcelo. While there Maggie worked as secretary and bookkeeper for her husband in his precision tool business. Later, Maggie worked with her husband in the insurance business as a Farmers Insurance Agent and later as a State Farm Agent. After Maggie's husband passed away in 1984, she moved to Colorado to be near her daughter and son. She then worked for the Hartford Insurance Company from which she retired at the age of 65. She continued working in a variety of other jobs until the age of 80.

Maggie is a true Kiwanian. She says that "With Kiwanis her life is complete." Four years ago she came from the Ken Caryl Kiwanis Club. Before that she was in the Lakewood Kiwanis Club. Meals on Wheels, the Action Center, the Arapahoe Philharmonic volunteer program, and the Salvation Army Christmas Bell Ringer program are just a few of the many Columbine Kiwanis Club programs that Maggie supports.

Maggie never misses an opportunity to help a friend, to provide company to someone who is lonely or to assist someone who is struggling with a disability. Maggie has always been fond of dancing and loves the ballet and concerts. - Bill Morrissey
