Meet Club Member Hazel Kinzer



Hazel (Durham) Kinzer, was born in Lancaster, PA in 1939. She has one brother, Jim. Their father owned a printing franchise. Hazel's mother worked with her father in the printing business. Hazel attended grade school and high school in Lancaster. After graduation from high school in 1957, she attended Millersville State Teachers College in Lancaster (now Millersville State University). Her high school sweetheart, George, who was two

year ahead of Hazel, thought they should both have their college degrees before they were married. That encouraged Hazel to graduate in just three years instead of the usual four years.

George and Hazel were married in 1960. After their marriage, they moved to New Brunswick, NJ where Hazel taught first grade and George attended graduate school at Rutgers University. Hazel stopped teaching after one year with the birth of their first child, Jeffery. Soon they had two more children, Kathy and Craig. Hazel and George now have seven grandchildren and nine great grandchildren.

The family moved to Colorado in 1972 with George's employer, Johns Manville Corporation. While in Colorado, Hazel relied on her teacher training and expertise to deliver adult education classes. With the advent of microwave ovens, GE and Whirlpool appliance stores needed instructors to demonstrate the convenience and safety of these new amenities. Hazel fulfilled that need by teaching microwave cooking classes. She also used her educational skills to teach Weight Watcher classes.
