Meet Fred Russell



Fred Russell, the newest member of the Columbine Kiwanis Club, was inducted on 4 October. Fred was born in Portland OR. in 1947. He was one of two boys in the family. His father was a Labor organizer with the International Association of Machinists and his mother a homemaker. Fred graduated from Oregon City High School in 1965 and entered Oregon State University in the ROTC program. He majored in Political Science and History. He graduated from Oregon

State University in 1969, with a Bachelor of Science degree and a Commission as an Air Force 2nd Lieutenant.

While a senior at Oregon State, Fred met Cindy Desch, a fellow student, and they were married in 1970. Six months after graduation from Oregon State, Fred entered active duty in a pilot training program at Webb AFB in Big Springs, TX. In 1970, Fred was transferred to McGuire AFB, where he also studied Business Administration and earned an MBA. In 1975, Fred transferred from active duty to the Air Force Reserve. He retired from the Air Force after five years of active duty and 19 years of Air Force Reserve

Fred and Cindy moved to Colorado in 1978 where he worked for Braniff International Airways from 1977 until 1984. Fred joined United Airlines in 1984 where he served as a flight instructor on the Boeing 727 and the Boeing 747-400. Fred returned to line flying in 1991, and they moved to Oregon in 1994. Fred retired from United Airlines in 2007. While in Oregon, Fred and his son-in-law purchased a Jiffy Lube franchise in 2005; they expanded to two franchises in 2006 and then to five in 2008. In 2015, they began divesting the franchises, and by 2016 they were back to the original two franchises.

In 2016, Fred and Cindy returned to Colorado where they wanted to retire. They have two daughters: Erin, who was born in 1973 and Megan, who was born in 1976. Erin lives in Bend, Oregon and Megan lives in Littleton, Colorado.

Fred and Mike Tanner had met briefly years before and renewed that acquaintance at a social event for their wives' organization. After attending several Columbine Club meetings with Mike, Fred liked what he saw and decided to join. Fred is not sure yet which projects he wants to support. One project he's interest in is the Blood drive and would like to look at expanding the program from whole blood donations to blood platelet donations.
