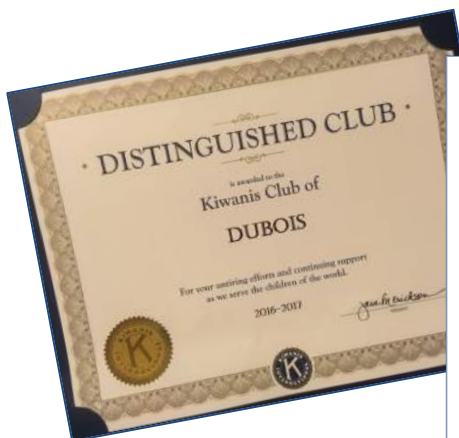
~ **Soupenanny Bake Sale** final report indicated profits of \$458

March & April Meeting Notes ~

March 6: WENDI HAYMAN, DIRECTOR DUFFY THERAPY & FITNESS CENTER

Because capacity has been exceeded and limits services, a \$250,000 expansion project is underway to more than double the size of the current facility. A private foundation has donated \$100,000 with a promise to match an additional \$50,000 in donations.

With more room, DT&FC will be able to expand fitness and nutrition classes, offer activities to youth, provide a multi-purpose room for community use and enhance the physical therapy space. Other upgrades would address HIPPA compliance in regards to restrooms and privacy.

Approximately 350 people utilize the facility annually and have access 24 hours a day through use of a combination keypad. Donations to the project via *Dubois Medical Center, Inc DBA Duffy Therapy & Fitness Center* are accepted at the center, Bank of Jackson Hole and by mail to PO Box 1203, Dubois.

Kiwanis Education

- Over 110 new clubs have been organized around the world since October 1, 2017.
- Las Vegas has 41 Key Clubs with more members than anywhere in the world – and just six Kiwanis clubs mentoring them.
- Three Amendments will be voted on at KI Convention in June: Clarification of district endorsement of candidates; Requirement that a KI Trustee complete their term as Immediate Past Governor before formally announcing candidacy; and proposed adoption of a new family membership status to allow a 50% KI dues discount for qualifying members
